

1886 Bk. Clarice log book

June 19th

Begins with strong breezes from E. N. E. Bark heading into the Bay of Carlisle run in and wore ship Mr. Clements came on board Braced forward and stood out to sea Middle part strong breezes and equally better at 2 A.M. wore ship and at 9 A.M. run into Carlisle bay wore ship and stood off shore

June 20th

Begins with fine weather at 3.30 P.M. work ship and stood into the Bay. got in at 3 P.M. Boats came of bringing Potatoes &c and soon Capt. Merchant. Bringing the Cooper, and Thomas Fisher who we supposed had deserted soon braced forward and stood out on Starboard tack flowed away chains washed decks &c. Middle & latter part strong trades Bk by the wind on Starboard tack.

Thursday

June 21st

First pt strong trades Bk by the wind on Starboard tack under whole topsails at 2.30 P.M. double reefed foretop sail & at 3.00 P.M. the main topsail watch employed about ship duty Middle part very equally with lightning & rain latter part better weather Lat 15.28 Long 59.36.

Wednesday 22nd

Strong part strong breezes from East Bk on Starboard tack under whole Main top sail Double reefed fore Courses Gills & Shanks altered 231 galls Main Middle & latter part fine breezes Bk steering N by E.

Lat by Obs 12.58 N
Long by Obs 59.58 W

Thursday
Friday 23rd

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from E. N. E. Bk steering N. W. by N. under Main top sail & flying gill, rose new wheelropes Middle & latter part Bk steering N by West, put on to the foretop gallant Mast & prevented Backstay Repaired & refitted rig &c &c

Saturday 24th Lat 20.30 Long 61.30

Begins with fine breezes Bk at N by W. watch employed about ship duty Middle & latter part very much the same took the Starboard Boat on deck and repaired her. Joseph Smith off duty from a sore foot hurt by

Sunday 25th

a club hammer which fell on it. Begins with light trades Bk under all sail steering N by W. Put the Starboard Boat on her cranes. At some time someone has chosen to cut the fore claw gamet & kept all hands on deck (as they all refused to tell who done it) filled 2 Casks with salt water and turned ship washed off the ship &c &c. Saw one sail Middle & latter part fine & pleasant weather Bk steering N by W. all sail out Lat 24.44 Long 62.20

Monday 26th

Begins with fine weather and light trades Bk steering N by W under all sail Joseph Smith still off duty Middle part same latter part employed painting S. B. & P. B. Saw one sail Lat 26.24 Long 62.44

Tuesday 27th

Begins with light trades Bk at N by W. watch finished painting Broke out Stone rent down & allowed away New foresail & Bent old one Broke out slop Cask and supplied men with clothing &c Joseph Smith and Thomas Fisher off duty Smith sore foot Fisher vomiting Middle and latter part light gills & calm Broke out water (254 galls) fluted Bow Bouts toward stern. About 8 inches further forward
