

1876 Remarks Continued
July 30th Sunday

During these 24 hours light air and squally, helping by the wind on Starboard tack the Ruptured man worse today. He took off the Bandages in the night in consequence of which he became much worse. Everything was done for him that could be done, while blowing down oil Thursday 28th Capt M. was knocked into the hole by a cask falling against him, he fortunately sustained no other injury than a sprained ankle his foot soon became swollen and painful, he is some better now. Lat 36.13 Long 48.01

Monday 31st

Begins with light airs from the South. Bark under all sail on Starboard tack by the wind Saw 3 Sail. Bark better tonight. Middle & latter part light breezes from S.W. Bark by the wind on Starboard tack at 5 A.M. Saw BK Swallow of New Bedford 4 months out with 175 bbls sperm oil at 10.30. Capt Capt Elles came on board latter part morning with the Swallow.

Tuesday Aug 1st Lat 36.18 Long 46.40

First part light airs & calm. Bark heading to the Eastward at 4 P.M. raised sperm Whales starting 3 miles off. Hoisted the American Ensign at the Mizzen peak and cleared away ft. Boats, Blown on about 5 P.M. part of the Whales started off and the boats chased until dark took the whale along side the Calaisce and prepared to cut him in. Middle part fine weather. Standing Boats crews at daybreak hooked on & cut in the whale finished at 5.45 A.M. Cut down gear, cleared away the head, cut up the blubber & started the bones, Bark returning different courses in company with Bark Swallow.

Wednesday Aug 2nd

Begins with light breezes from the Southwest. Bark by the wind on Starboard tack at 2.30 P.M. tacked and stood to. The Starboard by the wind in company with Bark Swallow. Employed Boiling Middle part finished boiling, whale turning up about 18 bbls at 7.30 run down to windward of BK Swallow and Capt Elles came on board, decided the Oil satisfactory to both parties and Capt Elles returned to his ship with his oil. Placed forward and stood along by the wind on Starboard tack under all sail started water.

Lat 36.55 Long 46.34

Thursday Aug 3rd

Commences with fine breezes from S.W. Bark on Starboard tack under all sail at sunset took in Mizzen & foretop gallant. Bark Swallow & another BK in sight. Latter part fine breezes from S.W. Bark on opposite tack. Latter part Bark on Starboard tack. Watch employed as usual one sail in light. Lat 36.18 Long 46.40

Friday Aug 4th

First part strong breezes Bark on Port tack at 4 P.M. passed Bark Arnold at 6 P.M. Wind moderated and Capt M. set a signal for a gam. Went on board. The is 1 month out. Middle & latter part very much the same. Bark on opposite tack working to windward.

Saturday Aug 5th

During these 24 hours fine breezes from S.W. Bark on opposite tack working to windward under all sail. Found a strong current running to seaward on acct. of which lost 8 or 10 miles. Blasted beef &c &c.
