Sunday 6th

Continued

First part light breezes from S.W. Bark on Starboard tack under all sail at about 3 P.M. Saw a ~~Sp~~ Whale Carcass on weather bow and at 3.30 another off lee bow. At 4 P.M. saw a Bark off lee bow under short sail Boiling, at 5.30 saw another sail on weather Bow she proved to be a whaler men pumping off & manuevering supposed she was chasing whales. At dark took in light sails & hauled up courses Middle & latter part fine and pleasant weather Bark on opposite tack saw 3 Sail Lat 36.30 Long 46.44

Monday Aug 7th

During these 24 hours strong winds at 2 P.M. close reefed foretop sail and double reefed Main shortly after found that the Main top gallant head stay had strangled, put on a preventer, Bark on Port tack. At 4 P.M. put the boats on upper crams Wind hauling from S.W. to N.W. & Barometer falling at sundown wore ship wind moderating Middle & latter part strong breezes but pleasant weather passed Bark opposite started 308 Galls water Lat 35.50

Tuesday Aug 8th

Began with strong breezes from the Westward Bark on opposite tack Middle & latter part very much the same

Wednesday Aug 9th

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from the N.W. Bark on opposite tack and steering different courses spoke BK tapping 9 months out with 5 or 600 ~~sp~~

Watch employed as usual

Thursday 10th

During these 24 hours fine breezes but smoked and some squalls Bark under all sail steering different courses Employed as usual Lat 35.48

Friday Aug 11th

During these 24 hours fine weather and moderate breezes from the Northward First part saw spermuses and one sail Middle part Bark by the wind on Starboard tack under easy sail at sunrise made all sail & steered E.S.E. at 6.15 A.M. raised 2 founts 1/2 p founts off lee bow called them ~~Sp~~ Whales at about 7 A.M. lowered the boats in pursuit at 10 A.M. concluded that they were not ~~Sp~~ Whales and called boats to the ship Bards with fine breezes from the Northward Bark under all sail steering E.S.E. Lat 35.54

Saturday Aug 12th

All these 24 hours fine breezes from the N.W. First and latter part Bark under all sail steering E.S.E. Middle part Bark under short sail & by the wind on Port tack saw one sail Watch employed about ship duty Lat 35.35 Long 45.25

Sunday Aug 13th

During these 24 hours fine breezes and pleasant weather Bark steering daphine E.S.E. under all sail Middle part under easy sail gimlet stabs and overhead Boat & c

Lat 35.20 Long 44.26

Monday Aug 14th

All these 24 hours fine weather First part Bark under all sail steering E.S.E. at sundown took in the light sails & hauled up the courses latter part all sail out Watch employed replacing Starboard overhead Boat starting water. Bread & Coopering provisions
