Sunday Nov 5th Remarks on board Bark Clarice of

First part light and variable air
Course E. S. E. Bent a new gaff topsail &
Morgan's topsail staysail & sail on right
Kielder & lights but very much the same

Monday Nov 6th

Lat 34° 30' Long 23° 20'
Commenced with fine breeze from
West S. W. Bk steering S. E. & sail in right
Middle & latter part light breeze from
West Bk steering S. E. Employed as usual

Tuesday 7th

Lat 34° 26' Long 23° 01'
Came on with fine breeze from
West Bk steering S. E. Bent a new
spanker at 5 P.M. spoke Bk Perry
of Boldgartown. Saw 8 or 9 sail. Hauled
the Perry up light & Perry Middle part fine
weather Bk steering S. E. at 6.33 the Perry
hoisted a large black whale and hoisted the
ensign to mizen at 8 A.M. hauled in ensign
at 11.30 P.M. the Clarice Lt. B. struck the whale
all hands pitching on and soon turned up.
The whale got him along side the Clarice
at 2 P.M. Lat 33° 31' Long 21° 00'

Wednesday 8th

Began with light breeze from the
Westward. Boat put to a float. Whale
got him to the ship at 2 P.M. got dinner
And Capt Bassett of the Perry with 6 or 8
men came on board and helped cut the
whale got his head off at dark and set
Boat crew at daylight hooked on to the
bow and took it on at 6 A.M. Capt Bassett
of the Perry came and took the whale's body to
his ship. Hooked on and took in the junk
also the case and got it ready for bailing

1876
Thursday 9th Boldgartown on a Whaling Voyage Merchant

First part fine weather wind S. W. Barometer
falling finished bailing the case and cut up
part of the junk Middle part thick cloudy weather
at 2 A.M. commenced to rain (cooled down)
at 4 started again. Latter part
thick cloudy weather all hands employed bailing
cutting up junk &c. the Perry in sight

Friday 10th

Came on with thick cloudy weather
wind Southerly. Barometer very low finished
cutting up junk & blubber at 7.30 P.M. Cooled down
& at daylight started again. Latter part
strong breeze and squally. Not employed
bailing Bk on Starboard tack. the Perry in sight

Saturday 11th

First part strong breeze & squally with
rain Bk on Port tack under close reef Mainsail
Foremast & Morgan's staysails at 4 P.M.
Cooled down. breeze light - but squally & squally
at 7 P.M. set close reefed Gaff topsail
Middle part very much the same
Latter part squally weather with Thunder Light
rain & heavy rain. Barometer down to 29 degrees

Sunday 12th

First part fresh gale from the Northwest
Bk on Port tack at 1 P.M. hauled the Mainsail
at 3 P.M. saw a Whaling Bark steering South
supposed her to be the Perry. Barometer still
down to 29 degrees. Middle part very much the
same. Latter part squally. Started the work
so being very squally & squally. Could not
make much headway

Monday 13th

Began with thick squally weather Bk under
close reefed Mainsail & Fore sail. Bailing
at 7 P.M. finished bailing. Whale's head turning
up & all latter part strong variable wind
with heavy squally wind about W. Bk S. W.
Barometer 29.50 Lat 33.58 Long 19.41
