

Dec. 16th Remarks on board of Bark Clarice

Monday 4th

First part equally weather with
some rain. Bk on Port tack under all sail
The man with the broken leg doing well
John Adams complaining. Put Limbs &
up on swelling some middle & latter part
fine breeze from the Eastward
Latter part Bk under all sail heading
to be forthward. Watch employed
Ratting down the Main Rigging. Dated Dec.

Tuesday 5th

First part fine weather & breeze
Bk on Starboard tack with Mizzen
Main topgallant sail & Gaff top sail out
Employed Ratting down Main Rigging
Saw one sail at sundown took on
light sails & tacked ship. Middle part
Latter part fine weather Bk on Starboard
tack under all sail. Watch employed about
ship duty. Finished Ratting down Main Rigging

Wednesday 6th

First part fine weather. Bk
on Starboard tack under all sail
at sundown went about and took
on the light sails & courses
Middle & latter part fine weather
and moderate breezes saw 1 sail
Watch employed about ship duty.

Thursday 7th

First part fine weather &
moderate breezes Bk by the wind
on Port tack, all sail out at sundown
took on the light sails and furlled
the mainsail. One sail in sight
Broken leg still improving nicely
Also John Adams
Middle & latter part fine weather
at daylight wore ship and made
all sail. Saw Porpoises & gamblers
John Adams better & on duty
Watch employed about ship duty.

Dec. 16th Of Edgartown. On a whaling voyage

Friday 8th

During these 24 hours fine weather
and fine breeze Bk cruising. Saw
Porpoises, better bottoms, shot several sail
Broken leg still doing well.
Watch employed about ship duty.

Saturday 9th

All these 24 hours fine weather &
fine breeze from E. N. E. Bk on Port tack
shortened sail at sundown and made
sail at daylight. Saw Porpoises
Started Water, Flour, & Beef.

Sunday 10th

First part fine weather & fine
breeze from the Northward & Eastward
Bk on Port tack under topsails, Gills & Spanker
at sundown double reefed the Foretop sail &
furlled the mainsail. Middle part strong
breeze latter part same. At 10.30 A.M.
sighted St. Antonio bearing S. S. E. & dist
about 30 miles. Saw one sail.

Monday 11th

Came on with strong breeze from the east
and Bk on Port tack standing into the
gale of St. Antonio stood on until within
about 5 miles then wore ship. Bk under
close reefed topsails & Foresail put the
Bow & Waist Boats on upper Cigars.
Middle & latter part strong breezes
Bk by the wind on Starboard tack
The Broken leg still doing well.

Tuesday 12th

First part strong breezes
Bk under close reefed topsails, Courses
Gills & Spanker saw 4 sail at sundown
took on Gills & Spanker. Middle part
strong winds furlled the mainsail
Latter part moderate gale saw one sail.
