Continued

Sunday July 22nd

Came on with fine weather and light air from the southward & eastward. Brought on Starboard tack by the wind one sail in sight at 9 P.M. Mr. Franklin requested Capt. Marchant to allow him to go to duty saying that he was sorry for what he had done and promising to make no further trouble. The Capt. told him that he could go to duty on those terms, and that if he made any further trouble he (the Capt.) would put him into the rum and keep him there the remainder of the voyage as long as he thought necessary up to the remainder of the voyage. Middle & latter part light winds B.R. bringing

Monday July 23rd

All these 24 hours light air and calm. Saw one sail also Porpoises, Gumpers. Watch employed about ship duty also getting out a topmast from the light picked up the 31st Lat by obs. 35.36 Long by Chron. 47.30 Started one last B.R.

Tuesday July 24th

First part light air and calm Middle same latter part fine weather and fine breeze from the westward B.R. under all sail steering different courses saw one sail Lat 35.54 Long 47.25

Wednesday July 25th

First part fine weather at 4.30 P.M. hove B.R. Catappa, Chase, 60 bbls down after seeing B.R. White 143 bbls Middle and latter part strong wind B.R. on Starboard tack under double reefed Main & close reefed Foretop and

Thursday July 26th

During these 24 hours strong winds first part B.R. on Starboard tack by the wind Middle same latter part B.R. steering N.E. & saw several sail Lat 35.15 Long 45.59

Friday July 27th

During these 24 hours Moderate Gale from the Westward first part B.R. under double reefed Main - close reefed Foretop sails & Foretop steering N.E. & at sundown took in the Foretop and came to the ground latter part B.R. by the wind Broke out water Lat 35.37 Long 46.24

Saturday July 28th

First part strong breeze and squally weather B.R. on Port tack under double reefed Main top and close reefed Foretop in sight Middle Calm latter part squally weather with occasional rain saw one sail Lat 35.51 Long 46.47

Sunday July 29th

Came on with light breeze from E.N.E. and squally weather B.R. on Starboard tack by the wind under all sail Watch employed about ship duty Middle and latter part fine weather B.R. by the wind on Starboard tack saw Gumpers Lat 36.38 Long 47.04

Monday July 30th

During these 24 hours light and variable winds and squally weather B.R. working to the Eastward Watch employed as usual Lat 37.00 Long 46.35
