First part cutting finished at dusk.
 Middle part & some of the cut
 is over. Latter part commenced boiling.
 Lat. $16^{\circ} 16' S$
 Long $5^{\circ} 49' East$

Thursday June 26th

First part fresh bladders on Starboard tack
 English & middle part were hauled. Latter
 part had taken on Port tack.
 The fore head in Lat. $16^{\circ} 48' S$.
 sail to midnaunce in Long.

Friday June 27th

First part fresh bladders, under down
 what is at 10 o'clock. The going to midnaunce
 and covered. The fore head's boats struck
 first time, and first that struck a large
 whale. The first blow was at 9 o'clock.
 C. M. and sent all hands below for the
 night. Latter part cutting.
 Lat. $16^{\circ} 35' S$.

Saturday June 28th

Wind light finished cutting the body
 and left the head alongside.
 and started the work again.
 Middle part boiling. Latter part covered
 down, and took in the junk,
 and baled the cut overboard.

Bark *Clance* Off the Coast of AfricaSunday June 29th

First part calm started the work again
 and cleared up the deck. Middle
 and boiling. Latter part on Port tack
 cutting and boiling down.
 Lat. $16^{\circ} 10' S$.

Monday June 30th

Light air, was boiling and getting
 under way. Middle part sent. Latter part
 boiling and stowing down.
 Lat. $16^{\circ} 35' S$.

Tuesday July 1st

First part fresh bladders on Port tack
 employed in stowing down and boiling
 Middle part & latter on Starboard tack.
 Finished boiling and stowed down a
 part. The fore head in sight to midnaunce.

Wednesday July 2nd

First part fresh bladders employed in
 stowing down. Middle & latter part stowing
 down.

Thursday July 3rd

First part stowing down on Starboard tack
 employed in stowing down Middle part
 in Port tack. Latter part on Starboard
 tack. The fore head in sight to midnaunce.
 Lat. $16^{\circ} 22' S$.
 Long
