

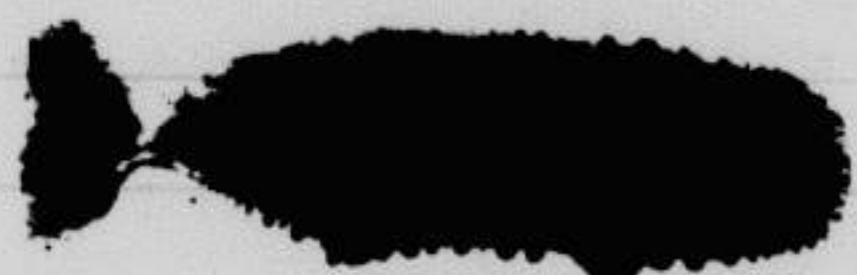
Bark *Clavie* Off The Coast of Africa

1879  
Friday July 4<sup>th</sup>  
First part light trawler on Port tack employed in stirring off the side & towing down net. Middle part the same. Latter part on Starboard tack.

Lat. 16° 34' S.  
Long. 5° 39' E.

Saturday July 5<sup>th</sup>  
First part light trawler on Starboard tack. Finishes stirring down and secured up the net. Middle part light trawler on Port tack. The Gay Head came to anchor over the raised a school of Sperm Whales about 11 o'clock P.M. under our eye and set the engine to mate & answer but the Gay Head did not answer it.

Long About 6-13 E  
Lat " 16-46 S.



Sunday July 6<sup>th</sup>  
Still chasing, in P.M. the Gay Head boats struck and the school started off to windward chased until 5 o'clock P.M. when came on board. Middle part on Starboard tack, latter part on Port tack.

Lat. 17° 18'  
Long. 5° 30'

Monday July 7<sup>th</sup>  
First part light trawler kept off N.W. then N. & E. Luffed to on Starboard tack at 11 o'clock. Latter part strong trawler.

Lat. 16° 41' S.

Tuesday July 8<sup>th</sup>  
First part strong trawler on Port tack. Middle part the same. Latter part kept off N. then luffed to on Starboard tack.

Lat. 16° 51' S. Long 5° 56' E.

Wednesday July 9<sup>th</sup>  
First part strong trawler on Starboard tack. Middle part on Port tack. Latter part raised a school of Sperm Whales going to windward. Chased them with the ship, but got no chance. They went out of sight about noon.

Lat. 16° 33' S.  
Long 6° 31' E.



Thursday July 10<sup>th</sup>  
First part strong trawler on Port tack. Middle part the same. Latter part on Starboard tack.
