

Back Chaise Towards St Helena 1879.

Wednesday Oct. 1st.

First part fine trader steering W. Middle part the same. Latter part raised the island of St Helena at 9 o'clock P.M.

Thursday Oct. 2nd.

First part fine trader. Off the sugar loaf at dusk & luffed to the north on Starboard tack under short sail. Latter part left off until the Capt went on shore, and came off again to work up to our anchor.

Harbor Log.

Friday Oct. 3rd.

First part same to our anchor in the harbor of St Helena at 8 o'clock A.M. Employed in breaking out oil and shipping it on board the Mary Alice Dorian.

Saturday Oct. 4th.

Employed in shipping oil.

Fine Weather, One inch of rain for a rain.

Sunday Oct. 5th.

Employed shipping oil and commenced setting up a shroud.

Monday Oct. 6th.

Employed in setting up shrouds, and standing off the bark.

Tuesday Oct. 7th.

Standing off the bark and setting up a shroud.

Wednesday Oct. 8th.

Standing off the bark and setting up a shroud.

At St Helena

Thursday Oct. 9th.

At work generally about the ship one watch on duty.

Friday Oct. 10th.

Giving liberty. Three of the Portuguese sailors have deserted.

Saturday Oct. 11th.

Employed in painting the tender and one watch on duty.

Sunday Oct. 12th.

Fine weather One watch on duty.

Monday Oct. 13th.

Light trader. Got of the crew on board all but four men who have deserted by.

Shipped three new men and got underway at 4 o'clock P.M.

Tuesday Oct. 14th.

First part got underway at 4 o'clock A.M. left the Capt on shore, stood out on the Starboard tack. Middle part light trader. Latter part went in and got the Capt, a new cork, and two more men.

Wednesday Oct. 15th.

First part light trader and cables lying to work. Off shore. Middle & Latter part fine light trader, by the wind on Port tack.
