First part fresh trader on Starboard tack.
Middle part on Port tack. Latter part on
Starboard again.

Lat. $15^{\circ} 02'$ S. Long 30 miles East.

Wednesday March 24th

First part fresh trader on Starboard tack.
Middle & latter part on Port tack.

Lat. $15^{\circ} 25'$ S. Long 7 miles East.

Thursday March 25th

First part fresh trader on Port tack. Middle
part the same. Latter part on Starboard tack.

Lat. $15^{\circ} 51'$ S. Long 13 miles East.

Friday March 26th

First part fresh trader steering E. S. E. Middle
part altered to on Port tack. Latter part steering
N. N. W.

Lat. $15^{\circ} 27'$ S. Long 30 miles N.

Saturday March 27th

First part fresh trader, steering West N. W.
Middle & latter part the same.

Lat. $15^{\circ} 14'$ S. Long $3^{\circ} 16'$ W.

Sunday March 28th

First part fresh trader, steering West half N.
Middle part the same. Latter part sighted
the Island of St. Helena at daybreak, and called
by the name on Port tack.

Barb. Clamie At St. Helena.

Monday Mar 29th

First part fresh trader, store of shore
came to on anchor in St. Helena at daylight.
A.M. Employed in cleaning ship.

Tuesday Mar 30

Employed in getting ready for water, and stowing
off the hole.

Wednesday Mar 31

Employed in getting water.

Thursday Mar April 1st

Employed in getting provisions, and shooks
from shore.

Friday April 2nd

Stowing away provisions.

Saturday April 3rd

Employed in stowing away the hole.

Sunday April 4th

Doing nothing, part of the crew ashore.

Monday April 5th

Employed in cording shooks. One watch on
Libby.

Tuesday April 6th

Employed in stowing away casks & shooks. One
watch on Libby.

Wednesday April 7th

Employed in cleaning up deck, and getting
ready for sea, and getting crew off.

Thursday April 8th

Employed in getting crew, recruits &c on board.
