

Bank Slave On The Coast Of Africa 1880

Sunday Sept. 19th

First part light breeze from the S.W. on Port tack spoke the Platina. Middle & Latter part the same.

Lat. $7^{\circ} 39'$ Long. $9^{\circ} 42'$ Monday Sept. 20th

First part light breeze from the S.W. on Port tack, and the people bunched the day.

Lat. $7^{\circ} 21'$ Long. $8^{\circ} 46'$ E.Tuesday Sept. 21st

First part fine light breeze from the S.W. on Port tack. Middle & Latter part the same.

Lat. $6^{\circ} 40'$ S. Long. $7^{\circ} 56'$ E.Wednesday Sept. 22nd

First part fine light breeze from the S.W. on Starboard tack. Spoke the Platina. Middle & Latter part steering S.E.

Lat. $7^{\circ} 0'$ S. Long. $8^{\circ} 33'$ E.Thursday Sept. 23rd

First part light breeze from the S.W. & the middle on Star. The Platina in sight. Middle part steering S.E. Latter part the same. Lat. $7^{\circ} 02'$ Long.

Friday Sept. 24th

First part light breeze steering E. S.E. Landed for black fish and got one. Spoke the Platina. Middle & Latter part the same.

Lat. $6^{\circ} 59'$ S. Long. $11^{\circ} 11'$ E.

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Saturday Sept. 25th

First part light breeze, steering E. & S. Middle part the same. Latter part steering E. S.E. Cloudy. Lat. $6^{\circ} 42'$ S. Long. $11^{\circ} 20'$ E.

Sunday Sept. 26th

First part light breeze steering E. Spoke the Platina. Middle part the same. Latter part raised "Port Pedron" reef east of Africa, about 7 o'clock A.M. and dept off leaving the land.

Monday Sept. 27th

First part fine breeze steering off along the land, another whaler in sight. Towards 1 P.M. came to an anchor at dusk off Labrador Bay. Saw seven vessels laying to.

Latter part came to land anchor, and got ready for water.

Tuesday Sept. 28th

Employed in getting water off and storing.

Wednesday Sept. 29th

Employed in getting wood and water.

Thursday Sept. 30th

Employed in getting wood & water.

Friday Sept. 1st

Employed in getting wood and water.

Saturday Oct. 1st

Finished getting off water and storing it down.
