

Sept 19. 1884 Klabenda

Mon This day begins with fine weather sent 2 two boats over after wood. got some trash to day latter part the ship Eliza Adams came in. taken six hundred specimens - - -
(also the Belta came in to anchor)

Tues 20. 1884 Klabenda

This day begins with very light weather the S.B. swash on liberty. received on board the remaining 45 fathoms of chain cable and shackled part of it together and bent in to the anchor also received 3 bbls of Butter & one shuck head cask of heads and hoops also 2 large bundle of shucks loaded them on deck fast at night 3 then ship came in sight at side so ends this day

Wed 21. 1884 Klabenda

This day begins with very light weather 3 then ship that was anchored outside last night stowed and sailed in to anchor Jerria Perry & Hilton & Heenele's one wash on shore having liberty just at night the Searainger came in port

Thurs 22. Klabenda

This day begins with very fine weather engaged painting with coal tar around the bands also received one small cask of coal from the Leathy Capt Vincent. exchanged some tools with Capt Chase also sold him one Ross darting gun and sold 26 pieces of brass to Capt Healer ship Orizer also sold one darting gun to Capt Potter ship Milton. so ends this day

Sept 23. 1884 Klabenda

Frid This day begins with moderate weather engaged fitting the fore royal rigging. also received one S.B. cask of meat from the S.B. all of our stuff seems stowed to the bottom of everything

Sat 24 Klabenda

This day begins with moderate weather engaged waiting for or provisions latter part received 2 four casks of meat and some small stores

Sund 25 Klabenda

This day ship lay in to anchor one ship came in to anchor so ends this day

Monday 26 Klabenda

This day ship still receiving stores from the S.B. middle part stowed down eight casks of meat on the port side also received one cask of bread 312 gals and stowed it below from the S.B. latter part got all of our provisions now are waiting for the S.B. to get ready to take the oil also got 1 cask of Molasses from the S.B. 149 gals and let Capt Robinson have 38 gals out of the cask so ends this day got one S.B. of meat from S.B.

Tues 27. Klabenda

This day still waiting for the S.B. to get ready to take our oil although we have but a small quantity this morning the S.B. shifted her anchorage farther outside so as to keep the men from running away so ends this day
