Thursday March 27 this day began with moderate wind from the trade and clear weather vessel under low sails on cruising. St Kitts and St Eustatius in sight. "Camis" also in sight pump attended to at 9 A.M. We lower the boat for West Shore to get on of the crew was sick, on shore for 17 days

Friday March 28, this day light wind from the trade and clear atmosphere at 1 P.M. boat went on shore to get Capt and sick man at 2.30 P.M. the boat returned on board with Capt and one of crew was sick he fell better able to go to sea at 3 P.M. we start to ground, pump attended to

Monday March 31 This day light wind from the trade and clear atmosphere vessel under low sail on starboard tack Steer NE by N pump attended to

Tuesday April 1 This day began with strong SE wind and clear weather in morning later part cloudy and rain vessel under two trysails on port tack head East saw a merchant bark bound NW pump attended to

Wednesday April 2 This day strong NE wind with rough sea vessel under two trysails and jib on starboard tack head N by W pump attended to

Thursday April 3 this day began with fresh breeze from the trade and cloudy weather vessel under two trysails and jib on starboard tack head N by W vessel shipped much water on deck pump attended to
