Thursday August 14 this day began with light
S.W. wind and squally weather. Vessel
under two trysails on port tack head
N.W. by W. at noon we raised a lone
Whale going quick to windward. We
lower three boats but can't head them off.
Boats returned on board, pump attended to.

Friday August 15 this day began with fresh
breezes from S.W. and clear weather
at 4:30 P.M. we raised a school of
Small Whales going to windward.
Quick we did not lower the boats
to jar and later pump attended to.

Saturday August 16 this day began with
strong westerly wind and clear weather.
Vessel under two trysails on port tack
head N.W. pump attended to.

Sunday August 17 this day began with
fresh breezes from West cloudy. Vessel
under two trysails on port tack
head North pump attended to.

Monday August 18 this day began with
strong N.W. wind and rough sea on
Vessel under trysails on Starboard
tack head West pump attended to.

Tuesday August 19 this day began with light
N.W. wind and clear weather. Vessel
under all sails set on port tack
head North at Sun Bet. we shorting
sails. Pump attended to.
raised school of Small Whales didn't get
any.

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Wednesday August 20 this day began with
very light wind from N.W. and
clear atmosphere. Vessel under all sails
set on port tack head N.W. at Sun
Bet. we shorting sails pump attended to.

Thursday August 21 this day began with light
wind from N.W. and squally. Vessel under
shorting sails pump attended to.

Friday August 22 this day very light wind
from N.W. and clear atmosphere.
Vessel under all sails set on port tack.
Saw two merchantman bound East
pump attended to.

Saturday August 23 this day began with light
N.W. wind and clear atmosphere. Vessel under
all sails set on Starboard tack head West.
Saw lots of crabs. Pump attended to.

Sunday August 24 this day began with strong
S.W. wind and squally weather. Vessel
under two trysails and set on port tack
head N.W. by W. pump attended to.

Monday August 25 this day began with light
N.W. wind and squally. Vessel under shorting
sails on Starboard tack head West by N. at
2 P.M. the weather clear up. We raised
two large whale. We lower three boats.
Caught one of them W.B. take along side
at 4 P.M. We put gear up ready to cutting
the meter morning pump attended to.
