

The Ship *Amatis* of New London 1837
Thursday August 17th Begins this day with fresh breeze from the S East and baffling the Middle Squally the Latter pleasant Ends 13.45

Friday August 18th Commences this day with strong breeze from the S East and clear the Middle and Latter Squally so Ends Lat 15.45 Lon 29.2

Saturday August 19th Begins this day with fine breeze from the S East and pleasant the Middle Squally Latter pleasant one Sail in sight Ends Lat 18.09 Lon 29.11

Sunday August 20th These twenty four hours begins with fine breeze from S East and pleasant one Sail in sight the Middle and Latter pleasant at 5 P.M. made the Isl of Trinidad West Dist 7 miles bore 3 Boats pulled in shore and pulled in shore in company with the Captain of Sagharber Capt Hale so Ends Lat 29.19

Monday August 21st The first part of these twenty four hours begins with fine breeze from the S East and pleasant the Middle and Latter part the same as the former so Ends the day Lat 29.30

Tuesday August 22nd Commences this day with light winds from the N East and pleasant the Middle and Latter part the same so Ends Lat 31.13 Lon by Chron 30.54

Wednesday August 23rd Begins this day with light breeze from the S East and pleasant the Middle and Latter part the same so Ends Lat

Thursday August 24th Commences this day with fine breeze from the N East and pleasant the Middle and Latter part the same Ends Lat 23.50 Long 33.00

Friday August 25th Towards the Coast of Chile 1837 Begins this day with light winds from the S East and clear the Middle and Latter part the same Ends Lat 25.19 Lon by Chron 35.35 Long by Luner 35.37

Saturday August 26th Commences this day with fine breeze from the S East and pleasant the Middle and Latter part the same so Ends Lat by Obs 27.00 Longitude by Chron 37.29

Sunday August 27th These twenty four hours begins with fresh breeze from the S East and pleasant from one part the Middle the same Latter carried away the fore topmast Stunty Sails so Ends Lat 28.57

Monday August 28th Begins this day with strong breeze from the N East and thick took in the Main topgallant Sail and single reef the Mizzen topgallant and Doubly reef the Middle light Squally with Rain the Latter plenty of Lightning and heavy Thunder so Ends Lat 30.30 Lon 40.39

Tuesday August 29th The first part of these twenty four hours begins with pleasant breeze from the Westward and clear the Middle and Latter light breeze and pleasant so Ends Lat 32.06 Long

Wednesday August 30th Commences this day with fine breeze and pleasant the wind from the N West the Middle light Squally of Rain and Lightning the Latter part the wind S and clear one Sail Standing to the Northward so Ends Lat by Obs 33.40 Lon 42.44 Longitude by Chron 42.40

Thursday August 31st Begins this day with strong breeze from the S East and clear the Middle light breeze and cloudy the Latter the same the wind from the S and a heavy swell from the Southward Ends Lat 46.17 Lon 34.3

Friday September 1st 1837 Commences this day with fine breeze from the N East and cloudy the Middle light Squally of Rain from the foretopmast and from the Mizzen the Latter thick fog and Rain the 10 the N and West Ends Lat by Chron 36.07 Lon
