1800 lbs but her haul a boat Soule, next 1400 lbs

1840 Ship Clements sailing to the Eastward
Wednesday Commenced this day with thick fog and rain
March 3 saw more of 143 ships every day but no whale
Middle and Latter part the same P. Enes

Latitude 16th 23 Long 176th 20
Thursday Commenced this day with fresh breeze from 99th
March 4 once cloudy Middle foggy Latter fresh. Pales
and squally Pales 2 white whales lance struck
the front of Enes P. Enes

Latitude 16th 20 Long 178th 00
Friday Begins this day with fresh Gales from 99th
and squally spoke the Alexander Mansfield
950 lbs Capt Douglas heard of the 56th March 5th
5 ships in sight saw one whale loosed struck him
killed took him a long side too rugged to cut Middle
rainy Latter clear at day live were ship and cut
him to the seaward Lat 16th 06 Long 179th 00

Saturday These twenty four hours begins with strong
breeze from South steering 89th on a wire three
ships in sight started the works Middle moderate
Latter part saw one white whale loosed struck killed
took him along side and cut him in Pot and Boat
stood the Whales Bay Harbour got 2 whales P. Enes

Latitude 16th 02 18th 00 East
Sunday Commenced this day with live bees from 99th
March 7 all day with live squalls of rain Middle
and Latter part the same spoke the 12th of Enes
1800 lbs got 4 cases water out of her!

Latitude 16th 02 Long 179th 30
Monday All this day fine pleasant weather 3 Ships
March 8 in view saw the 56th Mansfield cutting
a whale P. Enes 2000 lbs in boiling
Lat 16th 55 179th 05 well
