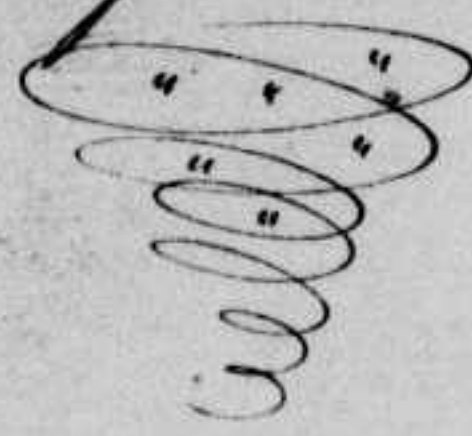

Sailed August 24th 1840



Bound to New. Lonsdon 1840
Yesterday Begins this day with a clear and cloudy
May 9 Sent Down the Stump Main Top & Mast
and sent up the long one sent up the
Fore and Main Top & yards. Midnight
Strong breeze attending with squally gusts
Double reefed the tops and furl the
jib being heavy from North East, night
and furl the main sail

Let more Long the same
Sunday Commenced this day with fresh breeze from
May 10 the sky and squally. Weather more moderate
let 2 reefs off. Once set the 1st & 2nd
Latter part fine weather the wind west
set the 1st & 2nd sent up the main royal
yard Lat 33° 02'

Monday Commenced this day with fine breeze
May 11 from the South and pleasant weather
and Latter part the same sent down
the cutting securing the carpenter
Employee in making a fore shed
Sail boom Lat 34° 28' Long 40° 40'

Tuesday Begins this day with fresh breeze from
May 12 West and fine weather. Saw a sail
bearing N. W. made part the same
Latter part the same of the former
Lat 30° 10' Long 37° 02'

Wednesday Commenced this day with fresh breeze and
May 13 squally. Midday part came on away
the tops. 4th boom sent up. Latter
part the tops. Latter strong breeze and
pleasant with Lat 28° 30' Long 36° 00'
