Wednesday - Continued this day with strong breeze from the S.W. clouds and dark heavy clouds in the eve. Sat. 4th. Whole day clear & beautiful in eve. much light on Mt. on his mountain strong Gale and fine weather Sat. 5th with clouds. P.O. 11

Employed in Boiling Potatoes 38th 22 Long 2nd
 There begins this day with fine pleasant weather. The
 (3000) and to cast the Crabs in sight. Late some
 Blackfish. The barid in got 4 Middle Cat. & so
 like was finished fishing. Broke out the main
 back to land this day 30th 22 38th 22

Friday (16th) - About four hours into bus from
 Bay C. 1/2 pm. - Striking Down the cat. Set for
 Flushing Set Striking C. S. C. To End.

November Commenced this day with fresh breez from the S. E. and
 Wednesday the 13th Cloudy weather at 10 A.M. fresh Main Breeze and
 at 1 P.M. the clouds thick fog came pouring at 10 P.M. fresh S.W. Gale
 by the 14th all sail set to the North on fresh from West S.W.

November 4. Spent this day with Henry here from 6 A.M. to 2 P.M.
Thursday 12. This morn. Ship left from 10 A.M. and 12 miles to the S.W. from 43 miles
from Middleport. Fine weather. Gales part calm.
To End of Lake 38° 13' Long by Cir 111° 13'

100 mbs. Commenced today with the land from 18th to 20th Sept. Charles
going quickly down did not get full at Junction below.
Just kept the ship E & S. Blue water. Charles told the
Charles Maude had gold from 18th to 20th in all said but still
barely plain top at 20th to the time back E & S. in a square
thence with rain. Thunder and lightning. Peter the Jones
at day the 1st the fore sail and fore top. Double reefed to E. end
Latitude 3 July 3 Longitude 164.36

4th. Arrived Camport this day with 1 strong Gale from S. & W. wind
Friday 14th Squally Gale a School of 12 Black. f. sh. fed on my out of
the ship. Midnight, more moderate with a heavy sea on
Porter, made all sail the kina and weather the same as the
former. To Kines Latitude 37.19 Longitude 147.51

November Begins this day with fresh breeze from the westward attended
Friday 13 with squalls of rain. Midnite the wind and weather the same
Saturday 14 fresh Gale from S.W. came squally & split the
main & royal & ends. Penn. Williams Pick
Latitude 36° 45' Long 51° 44'

November Commence this day with fresh Gales from S.W. and squally
Monday 16 Set fore top. Piece on bent the main. Mergal and fore
top mast & the sail once repaired them at Puntarenas.
3 Days more on arrival set main sail. Lb S. for top gal sail
Midnight. Pleasant. Set the same. Employed in repairing
sailed to Ensenada this day. Letter by vols 26-26 Long 55-55
