 January 14 and foggy Sails some fine backs Scize the
 Cook and Steward up in the cabin trying and
 floged them for fitting Middle calm and strong Sails
 fresh gales take one white whale board dories did not get
 fall Double reefed Tops and Stems 698 To End
 Latitude 43° 53' Longitude 85° 50'
 Friday Begins this day with strong gales from the NW and
 Jan 15 squally Middle more moderate Latter hard gales
 and squally steering to the Eastward Lat 43° 05'
 Long by Chron 88° 50' Long by Lunar 90° 00'
 Saturday Begins this day with severe gales from the NW
 January 16 attended with squalls at 4 P.M. saw a white whale
 close, next the main tops and failed the fore sail
 and tore the ship too with her barboard tack
 about Middle wind hauled more to the Southward
 Latter more moderate set Double reefed tops and
 1 tier 996 saw one white whale young quick to the
 Southward To End this day Lat 42° 55' Long 90° 00'
 Monday Comes this day with strong breeze from the NW and fresh
 Jan 17 Clouds moderate breeze and weather the same Latter foggy
 the main tops and bent another Camp in repairing the
 main tops To End Latitude 44° 40' Longitude 92° 00'
 Tuesday Comes this day with thick fog as usual the breeze NW
 Jan 18 Middle the same Latter fresh breeze saw some fine backs
 and prepared set up the main Staysail and the
 barboard sail To End of Round Ball

 January 19 bloody weather signs in the sky Lib. 330m at sundown
 full main sail and fore top gallion sail Middle raining
 Latter calm and foggy Sails for backs
 Latitude by Account 44° 50' Long Chron 97° 20'
 Wednesday Begins this day with calm and foggy weather with a Gale
 January 20 of wind or foggy Middle a breeze sprung up from the NW
 Latter fresh gales and thick fog and rain steering ESE
 by Compass To End Latitude by Account 45° 10' Long 99° 00'
 Thursday Comes this day with hard gales from the NW and thick
 January 21 and rain as usual at sundown lost reef the main
 tops and failed the fore tops Middle the same Latter
 more moderate drove the waste boat let the pumps out of
 the main tops and set the main top gallion sail
 Latitude 45° 30' Long Chron 101° 38'
 Friday Begins this day with fresh breeze and squally Camp in
 Jan 22 repairing the main tops Middle and Latter strong gales
 as usual To End Latitude 45° 22' Long 105° 38'
 Saturday These twenty four hours begins with fresh gales from East
 Jan 23 and squally at 8 P.M. lost reef tops Middle full
 the fore sail Latter severe gales from W by S storm with squalls
 of hail and rain To End
 Latitude 45° 03' Long 108° 26'
 Sunday Comes this day with severe gales from the NW attended with
 Jan 24 heavy squalls of hail and snow Middle and Latter more
 moderate To End
 Latitude 44° 45' Longitude by Chron 113° 25'
 Monday Comes this day with strong gales and a dark cloudy
 January 25 weather the breeze NW Middle and Latter full the
 fore sail next the main tops To End
