February Commenced this day with fresh breeze from the north
February 20 Middle and latter part the same cannot call down
to the north So Enes

Not observation

February Begins this day with fresh gales from the N at 10
Sunday 21 took in all sail sails down fine. Backs Middle and
latter part the same So Enes

Latitude 47° 07' Long 171° 31'

February Commenced this day with strong breeze with a heavy swell
Monday 22 on sails on white whale board struck did not get
fast Middle and latter end state plenty of fish
So Enes Latitude 46° 38' Long 171° 36'

February Begins this day with fresh gales from the north
Monday 23 with a heavy swell on sails on white whale board
did not get fast the whale going quite well.
the northward spoke the Horn Williams of Ipswich
6 months out 10 whales Middle and latter end gale
at midnite the wind shifted to the N So Enes
Latitude 46° 26' Long 171° 20'

February Begins this day with fresh gales from the north
Monday 24 a heavy breeze on two sails in sight Middle and latter
end calm state a number of white whales and fine black
struck on white whale hile and took him along side
So Enes Latitude 45° 53'

February Commenced this day with calm weather with a heavy
Thursday 25 took on cut the whale Middle and latter fine weather
sails whales board struck one held took him along
side and cut him in 2 parts in sight of ship
Lat 45° 43' Long 171° 30'

February Commenced this day with fresh breeze from the north
Friday 26 of white whales struck hile took him along side
Middle and latter the same ship in sailing So Enes
Latitude 46° 43' Long 171° 40'

Friday 27 Begins this day with fresh gales and clear weather the
February 27 fine ex. & state plenty of whales Middle and latter fine
to catch state whales board struck on hile took him along
side ship in sailing So Enes

Latitude 46° 48'

Sunday Begins this day with fine weather cut the whale spoke
February 28 the white men of Haver 6 months out 6 or 6 1/2
Middle and latter the same ship in sailing set 400 lbs
between decks So Enes state a number of whales So Enes

Latitude 46° 38' Long 171° 26'

Monday Begins this day with fresh breeze and pleasant weather
Wednesday Middle and latter the same ship in sailing set 10 fops
between decks So Enes state some whales So Enes

Latitude 46° 38' Long 171° 26'

Thursday Commenced this day with fresh breeze and thick cloudy weather
March 2 state 2 white whales board did not get fast Middle
the wind shifted to the N So Enes the wind shifted to
the N So Enes further sailing set 5 fops better and
the short casked So Enes with fresh gales and broken cloud
weather Latitude 46° 23' Long 171° 25'

Wednesday Begins this day with strong breeze with a heavy swell
March 3 on set double reef kept calm and clear at 4 pm through
the day latter like had calm sea a number of whales
saw 3 or 6 times struck on hile So Enes
Latitude 45° 45' Long 171° 25'

Thursday Commenced this day with calm weather there the whale
March 4 along side at 8 PM commenced cutting penstock at
11 set the watches and started the workers
Middle and latter fresh breeze and cloudy weather
state a number of whales board struck on hile took
him along side and cut him in 2 parts in sailing
three ships in sight So Enes 300 lbs

Friday 28 Commenced this day with fresh breeze from the north
Saturday 29 state 2500 lbs or 40 whales
