

Ship Climatis from Cape Horn 1841

Friday Begins this day with little baffling winds with a heavy April 16 North on the wind & by East with more east Ship Middle and Tatter the same So Ends

Latitude 57° 39' Long etc 65° 15'

Saturday Commences this day with fine breeze from the north to be so April 17 much favoured with a head wind at present Middle and Tatter part the same as the former So Ends

Latitude 57° 18' Long 64° 25'

Sunday Breeze nearly four hours begins with heavy Gale to be April 18 in all sail and have too at midnite let main tops and fore sail and kept off her course Tatter little baffled from N.E. to N.W. and squally So Ends

Latitude by L.C. 56° 40' Long 63°

Monday Begins this day with fine breeze from S.E. and too pleasant April 19 to last Midnite the wind hauled north Tatter fine weather with a head wind as usual. Shooked the water casks. Ends

Latitude 55° 28' Long Chron 61° 24'

Tuesday Commences this day with fresh breeze from N.E. and fair to April 20 at some fine backs Middle and Tatter part the same

Latitude 55° 00' Long 57° 46'

Wednesday Begins this day with fine breeze from the N.E. and April 21 fair weather Middle strong breeze and clear day weather

Tatter hard breeze from north east night the tops

and furled the courses So Ends this day with a head wind as usual Latitude 54° 14' Long 60° 34'

Thursday Commences this day with hard Gales from N.E. and dark April 22 cloudy weather Middle the same Tatter fine weather

the breeze from the N.E. made all sail So Ends

N.E. observations Latitude etc 53° 14' Long etc 53° 14'

Friday Begins this day with fine weather the same N.E. all day April 23 with fog squally Middle the same Tatter the breeze

26 28 days the N.E. as usual So Ends Latitude by L.C. 52° 47' Long

Round for the ports of Sumatra 1841

Saturday Commences this day with strong breeze from N.E. and thick April 24 foggy weather furled tops that sails Middle and Tatter

part the same So Ends Latitude etc 51° 14' Long etc 47° 50'

Sunday Begins this day with little breeze from N.E. and rising Middle April 25 Calm Had Breeze taken with a first while at the helms

took him up for dead he soon recovered Tatter fresh Gales

from the S.E. and dark rainy weather part the fore tops that

Joseph Lillar fell from the fore top Gallant yard over board

speaking the death the ship going at the rate of 8 knots let

the ship come too and came to anchor He had sunk to rise

no more he has since gone to a place of eternal rest or end of

misery Tatter rest the tops So Ends this day 58° 46'

Latitude 51° 02' Long 47° 26'

Monday Commences this day with heavy Gales from the N.E. and April 26 plenty of rain and hail furled the fore and main tops

and closed reef the main Middle the same with change of sea

on Tatter more moderate let double reef tops So Ends

Latitude 47° 44' Long Chron 49° 45'

Tuesday Begins this day with fresh Gales from N.E. and clear April 27 Middle and Tatter part the same So Ends saw a

white whale

Latitude 45° 16' Long 48° 55'

Wednesday All these nearly four hours fine breeze from the N.E. and April 28 fair weather Tatter a Breeze blowing N.E. & E. in departing

stated that the rats quarters to pieces So Ends

Latitude 43° 01' Long Chron 46° 45'

Thursday Begins this day with fine breeze from the N.E. and April 29 fine passing breeze Middle and Tatter the same

and the former Camp in various jobs So Ends

Latitude 41° 05' Long 43° 38'

Friday Commences this day with little breeze from the N.E. and clear April 30 Middle the same Tatter the breeze hauled to the east 26 9 days So Ends Latitude 39° 55' Long 41° 38'
