In the years 1841 and 1842
(1841-42)

Ship Climax, Monday the 10th June 1841
At 6 AM got under way and beat down the
harbour towards the Spit to the S. E. and
thence by and by to E. and

August 1st Commenced this day with fine breeze from the
N. W. and thick rainy weather beat down
through the race at 1 P.M. the Spit
Left Montagu bearing S. E. at 8 P.M. 13 knots
S. E. bearing N. E. & W. 7 leagues from
Whitby the my departure chose the weather
and now the anchor and on bent the
chance - minute fresh breeze fresh
Galant sailed and single reef 10 knots
at day like wind with sail spoke a S. E.
Shoring at 10 P.M. in heavy weather
to E. and S. E. Lat. 40.30

August 2nd Commenced this day with fine breeze from the
N. W. and thick weather middle and S. E. and
part the same to E. and S. E.
Lat. 40.15 Long 60.45

August 3rd Breeze this day with fresh breeze from
N. W. the S. E. and S. W. and S. E. and S. E. and S. E.
faint S. E. and S. W. and S. E. and S. E. and S. E.
weather the same S. E. more moderate
out puff and set 10 knots Galant sailed to E. and S. E.
Lat. 40.31 Long 60.45

August 4th Breeze strong S. E. and S. W. and S. E. and S. E.
