very bad took in the fore sail and hoisted
heaving South Middle finisht boiling
Patter strong held as usual - Ends

Monday Begins this day with fresh gales from N.W. 13 and

piled out the main hatch and commenced stowing
down - Ends

January 11th nothing of ships in sight stood to the Southward
