January Commences this day with fresh gales from the westward
 Wednesday 12 a thick rainy weather Middle and Latter the
 same saw one white whale hit the ship came too

January All these twenty four hours fresh gales saw a large
 Wednesday 13 steering East Enos

Latitude 43°47' Long 127°47'

January Begins this day with horse gales as usual further
 Thursday 14 the fore sail Middle and Latter brace and weather
 the same running East under easy sail saw a dark bay
 too Enos

Latitude 43°39' Long Chron 129°32'

January Commences this day with fresh gales from west to west
 Saturday 15 Middle and Latter the same steering E by South

Latitude 43°47' Long 132°03'

January Strong gales as usual steering East under easy
 Sunday 16 sail night Middle and Latter more moderate set
 main top gallant sail saw a merchant ship steering
 East. Enos

Latitude 43°47' Long Chron 135°03'

January Commences this day with light hawking wind saw some porpoise
 Monday 17 about the fore sail and fore top and beat others at
 sundown double top tops showed PC Middle and Latter
 thick rainy weather saw one white whale Enos

Latitude by AC 44°50' Long Ch. 135°31'

January Commences this day with thick rainy weather the wind
 Monday 18 from the Eastward Middle the same shifted
 NW and fog as usual Enos

Latitude 45°15' Long 136°50'

January Commences this day with fresh gales from the NW
 Wednesday 19 Middle and Latter the same steering East
 Camp in repairing the fore top
 16th days Latitude 44°50' Long 139°33'

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Thursday Begins this day with horse gales from NW
 January 20 Middle and Latter the same Enos all sail
 steering East. Enos

Latitude 45°03' Long by Chron 142°57'

Friday Commences this day with fresh breeze with a heavy fog
 January 21 still on saw 5 white whales loona struck on whale
 took him along side Middle and Latter moderate
 by stars with a heavy swell on as usual cut the whale in Enos

Latitude 45°13' Long Chron 143°38'

Saturday Strong breeze and perfect whaling saw three white
 January 22 whales loona struck one held took him along

at sundown too pushed to cut at three then
 could cutting finished at sundown started the work
 again the day in strong gales and fair weather

Latitude 45°52' Long Chron 143°34'

Sunday Begins this day with fresh gales from the NW
 January 23 fine cloudy still a ship steering East
 Middle and Latter the same Camp in boiling

Latitude 45°43' Long 144°20'

Monday Commences this day with fresh gales and thick rainy
 January 24 weather spoke the Montezuma of New Bedford
 10 whales midnite strong gales Latter more moderate
 and thick and rainy Camp in boiling So Enos
 saw one whale Latitude 45°07' Long 145°04'

Tuesday Begins this day with fresh gales with a heavy sea
 January 25 in steering South East saw a ship steering East
 Middle and Latter moderate saw 5 lb oil
 down the after hatch saw nothing so Enos

Latitude 45°43' Long 147°58'

Wednesday Commences this day with light breeze from the NW
 January 26 Middle calm - Latter fresh breeze from the SE and
 dark cloudy weather saw number of birds
 17 days Latitude 45°41' Long 149°33'
