

Ship Climatis of New London 1842

Thursday Commenced this day with fresh breeze from the S.W. and
January 27 cloudy weather at sundown double reefed the tops
staying East Middle and Latter fine weather
fired 6 pipes with fresh water saw one Spout Sals
it no more. To End the Day bound East

Latitude 45° 21' Long 152° 10'

Friday Commenced this day with fine breeze from the S.W. and
January 28 E.P.E. Middle and Latter the same Sals nothing
No observation Latitude 45° 53' Long 154° 0'

Saturday Begins this day with calm weather the breeze S.W.
January 29 Middle and Latter like baffling winds
all the lower wind and still on deck once in
Sals nothing Ends the Day in working East
Latitude 46° 27' Long 154° 53'

Sunday We have fine Easterly weather and no whaling
January 30 Middle and Latter thick fog and raining the
p.m. N.W. saw a number of black birds Ends
No obs Latitude 46° 39' Long 156° 33'

Monday Like fine and foggy weather the breeze N.W. and
January 31 Midnite wind and weather the same
Latter part fresh breeze from the S.W. saw nothing
course East S.W.

Latitude 48° 02' Long 159° 16'

Tuesday Commenced this day with strong breeze from S.W. and
February 1 dark cloudy weather set fore top and sail
Middle and Latter fine breeze and cloudy day
Latitude 48° 16' Long Chron 159° 58'

Wednesday Commenced this day with like breeze and fog squalls
February 2 saw 3 white whales bore struck a cow and calf.
Took them along. Late at 11 P.M. Midnite
calm Latter strong breeze at 3 A.M. coming out
fresh at 7 P.M. with fresh Sals and
Latitude 48° 26' Long 160° 00'

Howard's New Latitude 1842

Thursday Commenced this day with strong Sals from S.W. and
February 3 to S.W. and equally Midnite minor moderate
Latter strong Sals at Midnite saw 2 white whales
going quick to the Eastward one sail in sight
Started the works To End the Day

Latitude 48° 14' Long Chron 160° 40'

Friday We have strong Sals from S.W. and dark
February 4 cloudy weather Midnite clear Latter more moody
set the fore top double reef staying E by S
End in billowing End
Latitude by AC 48° 28' Long Chron 161° 00'

Saturday Commenced this day with more moderate weather
February 5 South a head sea on Sals a school of sperm
whales bore struck & saved 3 took them
along side blow on fresh let them lay Middle
and Latter part fresh Sals as usual finished
Ends Latitude 48° 14' Long Chron 162° 31'

Sunday Commenced this day with fresh Sals from S.W. finished
February 6 billowing started 70 lbs oil down the fore hatch to rig
to cut the whaling Midnite moderate Latter calm
cut the whales in and commenced clearing away the
heads one ship in sight To End
No observations

Monday Finished clearing away the heads blast on fresh from
February 7 N.W. and thick fog and raining Middle part
wind and weather the same Latter wind shifted
E.P.E. fresh Sals and thick fog and raining started
the works spoke the Thomas Dickerson of Sag-
harbour 1510 66 lbs Lat his second officer killed by
a whale To End the Day
Latitude by AC 48° 30' Long 163° 00'
