Tuesday Fresh gales from the S. and S.W. sea 2.40
February 22 Whales loosed did not get near them spoke the
Jonah Church ship 6 months 600 bbls spoke
the Black Stone 1200 To End the day steering
S.W. Latitude 46°05' Long 173°40'

Wednesday Commenced this day with fresh gales and thick weather
February 23 saw some fin backs & ships in sight
middle and latter more moderate set double
raft spoke the George of Mass 2700 three ships
in sight spoke the Mancy of Mass 450 bbls
stood South Latitude 46°00' Long nothing

Thursday Begins this day with fresh gales and moderate
February 24 midnite more moderate latter fine weather saw
the same saw three ships
Latitude 44°20' Long 174°20'

Friday Commenced this day with fine weather saw nothing
February 25 spoke the Mancy of Mass 10 months out 1300 bbls
ships in sight End the day
Latitude 44°05' Long Chron 175°00'

Saturday Commenced this day with fine weather saw nothing
February 26 nothing heading S.W. middle and latter the same
3 ships in sight saw nothing End
Latitude 43°50' Long Chron 175°34'

Sunday Begins this day with fine weather and fair weather spoke
February 27 the Mancy of Greenport 1050 bbls three ships in
sight saw fin backs middle and latter calm 3 ships
in sight saw nothing End Latitude 45°09' Long 175°30'

Monday Commenced this day with fine weather and fair weather
February 28 weather 5 ships in sight one cutting saw several
whales loosed for one did not get fast middle and
latter fresh gales with a heavy sea and four ships
in sight
205 Long Latitude 45°26' Long Chron 176°28'

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Cruising for Whales off New Zealand 1822

Tuesday Begins this day with fresh gales set double raft
March 1 spoke the Mancy of Mass 450 bbls
stood South Latitude 46°00' Long nothing

Wednesday Commenced this day with fresh breeze from the west set single
raft spoke the George of Mass 2700 three ships
in sight middle fresh gales at day late wind hauled
off latter calm saw nothing End this day
Latitude 45°29' Long Chron 176°26'

Thursday Begins this day with calm weather - the wind
March 2 five ships in sight at sundown double raft spoke
the Mancy of Mass 450 bbls by compass middle and latter
baffling wind saw 2 white whales and very late
To End
Latitude 45°40' Long Chron 176°34'

Friday Commenced this day with fine weather and fair weather
March 3 saw several white whales loosed could not get near
them at dark two whales came along side the ship
middle calm whales around the ship - latter fine breeze
and fair weather saw a number of whales loosed struck
the Mancy of Mass 450 bbls and cut him in the George
of Mass in sight and 3 other ships. End
Latitude 45°33' Long Chron 177°16'

Saturday Commenced this day with strong breeze double raft spoke
March 4 wine North saw several whales too puffed to loose
middle fresh gales latter the same three ships in sight
End Latitude 45°28' Long Chron 177°04'

Sunday Begins this day with more moderate weather
March 5 employed in balling spoke the Thom Dickerson
3 whales since we saw how middle and latter
fresh gales two ships in sight and they
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
