March Commences this day with hard gales from N.W. and
Monday squally ships a sea broke the after davit to N.
bough. Boat. finish boiling. Moderate weather
the same latter more moderate. Hoisted the Oct. do
the after hatch three ships in sight Enes

Latitude 45° 30' Long 178° 04' East
March Commence this day with fresh gales from N.W. to N. E. Middle
Tuesday same latter the same Enes five ships in sight.

Latitude 44° 47' Long 177° 53'
March Commence this day with strong breeze set double keel to
Wednesday saw one white whale Middle and latter the
same latter fresh breeze from N.E. cloudy with fog
Middle saw several white whales soared struck one
kila took him along side and cut him in five ships
in sight Enes

Latitude 44° 48'
March Begins this day with late breeze from the Southward
Thursday started the works Middle and latter the same
Emp in chasing whales 6 ships in sight and procured
a boiling Enes the day

Latitude 44° 48' 177° 46' Long
March Commence this day with fresh breeze from the N.E.
Friday saw plenty of whales and very much spoke
a large barque belonging to Wareham 20 months
out 2200 barrels of oil Middle and latter fresh
breeze from N.W. saw plenty of fin backs and
one ship Emp in chasing down Enes

Latitude 44° 45' Long 181° 39'
March Begins this day with fresh gales all the ships
Saturday 12 Closest yet saw white whales soared struck one
kila took him along side wore ship and cut him
to pieces Middle and latter late breeze and
foggy late nothing No observation.

Cruising to the west of the Chatham Islands
Sunday Saw breeze from the N.W. ship heading to by South
March 13 Emp in boiling Middle and latter thick fog and
rainy. The wheel shifted to the Southward. Saw a ship
heading to the westward Emp in boiling Enes

Monday Commence this day with thick weather Middle and latter
March 14 the same saw fin backs three 31 bbls. oil done this
fore hatch Enes this day

Tuesday Begins this day with fine breeze and foggy sea
March 15 6 ships done a cutting some a boiling others whaling
saw white whales but could not get hold of one whale
fine weather latter saw several whales soared struck one
kila took him along side and cut him in started
the works so Enes the day

Wednesday Commence this day with fresh breeze from the N.E. and
March 16 foggy saw 3 whales soared did not get near them
Middle the same latter foggy saw three whales too foggy
to whale 4 ships in sight Emp in boiling Enes

Thursday Commence this day with fresh gales and fog breeze in N.E.
March 17 saw white whales Middle and latter the same

Friday Thick fog and rainy weather strong breeze from
March 18 the N.W. finish boiling. Enes

Latitude 45° 21' Long 177° 33'
Saturday Commence this day with fresh gales from the N.W. and broken
March 19 cloudy to N.W. Middle more moderate latter fresh breeze
and a heavy swell on saw white whales soared struck one
two saved one the other took the line cut the
whale three ships in sight Enes the day in strong
breeze and heavy whaling - Latitude 45° 18'
