

Ship *Albatross* of *Midson* 1842

Tuesday Begins this day with fine breeze from the South
May 10 Steering E by N at 5 P.M. saw the Ill. *Brookline*
Bearing North Dist 8 Steaming at Double reef
Top and hauled by a wind. Middle pleasant

Sailed the same boat up the main top Gallant Mast
and yard emp in ship's duty To Enes

Latitude 23° 25' Long 147° 07'
Chron 1482 29 Chron 40 miles to the East true Long

Wednesday Commenced this day with light breeze from the Southward
May 11 at dark took in sail. Middle and latter wind
land in sight all hands emp in ship's duty

Latitude 22° 28' Long 148° 28'

Thursday Begins this day with fine breeze from E by S and
May 12 Middle and latter the same all hands emp
in ship's duty Latitude 21° 28' Long 148° 10'

Friday Commenced this day with light breeze and some
May 13 light clouds

Latitude 20° 40' Long 147° 38'

Saturday All this day with light baffling winds from
May 14 the northward and rainy

Observer Lat 19° 57'

Sunday Calm and rainy Middle and latter
May 15 light baffling winds

Latitude 19° 55' Long 146° 50'

Monday Set in air from the North and dark breeze
May 16 cloudy in the night

Latitude 19° 50' Long 146° 47'

Monday Begins this day with light breeze from the North
May 17 and equally Middle and latter the same

Latitude 19° 13' Long 146° 00'

Bound to *Florida* 1842

Wednesday Commenced this day with light baffling winds Middle and
May 18 latter the same Latitude 18° 02' Long Chron 147° 07'
Thursday Commenced this day with fine breeze from the S E part
May 19 the Mainboard anchored on the beach

Thursday All these twenty four hours strong breeze from the
May 19 S E and equally Double reef Top

Latitude 18° 02' Long 147° 07'

Friday Commenced this day with pleasant breeze from the
May 20 S E Steering E by S at Sundown. Saw the Ill.
Mainboard latter same at 6 M Made the Ill. of
Statute Dist 30 miles bearing E by S

Latitude 17° 40' Long 147° 43'

Saturday Commenced this day with strong trades double
May 21 reef Tops stood of and on latter made all
sail and steered for Point Venus
Chron miles E by S from Cape Venus is a coral
reef 4 miles from the shore with 16 feet of water
on it at half flood

Sunday Commenced this day with strong trades at 4 P.M.
May 22 took a pilot and anchor in 12 fath. water
15 fath. Chard Enes

at 8 A.M. the Pilot came aboard and
Thursday Got under way with a fine breeze from the S E
June 3 and we proceeded to sea Enes the day

Friday Commenced with fine breeze from the northward
June 3 and clear

(Enes as usual)
