Saturday Commenced this day with strong breeze from South and
October 22 fair weather saw 2 white whales heard did not get
 fast the Emerald in company

Middle and latter the same So Ends

Sunday Commenced this day with fresh breeze from S.W. and
October 23 white whale did not get fast two ships in sight
 Midnight the same carried all sail steering South
 Little calm Ends No Observations

Monday Begins this day with calm weather and thick fog and
October 24 strong rain Nothing Middle and latter the same Ends

Latitude 39°20 Longitude 76°00

Tuesday Commenced this day with fresh gales and squally weather
October 25 the same latter saw number of whales struck one
 and the Iron broke Ends

Latitude 40°25 Longitude 76°20

Wednesday Begins this day with strong breeze from the S.E. and dark
October 26 cloudy weather upon the Iron of New Bedford
 thirty nine months out 1300 upon the mate got
 his leg broke saw number of whales and very cold
 Middle and latter strong gales from S.E. and squally
 weather saw Nothing Ends

Thursday Commenced this day with more moderate weather
October 27 set the tops double reef saw Nothing

Midnight calm latter fresh gales from North and
 thick fog and rain saw 2 white whales heard did
 not fast Ends

Friday Begins this day with fresh gales and stormy weather
October 28 Middle and latter the same Ends saw
 Nothing Latitude 41°01 Longitude 75°29

Saturday Commenced this day with fresh gales and dark rainy weather
October 29 steering South Latitude 42°20 Longitude 75°25 saw Nothing
 were ship heading North strong winds from W.W. and
 and squally weather

Sunday Begins this day with fresh gales from west and squally
October 30 Middle the same bore ship heading S.W. at day light
 Made all sail time from the Northland saw 9 sperm
 whales heard took one 35 lbs whale took him along
 side blew on fresh land in sight

Monday Were ship and cut the whale to seaward Middle there
October 31 gales and squally weather Camp in boiling

Tuesday Commenced this day with more moderate weather
November 1 set single reef tops working off shore land in sight
 and no whales Middle and latter fine weather
 finished boiling Ends

Wednesday Begins this day with fresh breeze saw number of
November 2 fin backs saw in sight Middle fresh gales latter
 time hauls west saw several whales one ship in sight
 Ends the day Latitude 40°50 Longitude 75°55

Thursday Commenced this day with fresh gales from S.W. and storm
November 3 six pipes sperm oil down the fore hole Midnight
 the same latter more moderate two ships
 in sight Ends Latitude 40°48 Longitude 76°15

Friday Commenced this day with fresh breeze saw number
November 4 of whales struck one threw the Boat board
 again struck 3 killed took one along side the ship
 Drifted over the other one and sunk him as usual
 as usual what is done cant be helped Latitude
