Monday Commenced this day with strong gales from N.E. and
Seems Squally. Middle and latter the same times

Latitude 53° 33' Long 62° 50'

Tuesday Commenced this day with lite baffling breezes Middle
Seems and latter time and weather the same

Latitude 54° 35' Long 62° 50'

Wednesday Begins this day with lite baffling breezes from
Steering the Eastward saw many of these rips and found
Middle lite and from North latter fresh gales from
the Northward and thick rainy weather

Latitude 44° 30' Long 60° 00'

Thursday Commenced this day with strong gales from the Northward
Seems at 4 P.M. and latter the same and squally Middle
and latter fine breeze. See Ellinson had a number of
fish. So ended the day

Latitude 52° 55' Long 56° 48'

Friday Begins this day with strong breeze and squally weather
Seems from N.W. Middle and latter the same

Latitude 51° 23' Long 54° 40'

Saturday Commenced this day with fresh breeze from N.E. past the
Decem 10 Falkland Id. Middle and latter fine weather

Latitude 49° 53' Long 53° 15'

Sunday Strong breeze from N.E. and squally steering
Decem 11 at 8 P.M. Midnight Squally Double reef tops
latter out reef and let top gall sails. Sea very
very sick

Latitude 47° 23' Long 51° 44'

Monday Begins this day with strong gales from N.E.
Decem 12 Middle the same. Latter Middle and latter the
same Double reef tops

Latitude 46° 50'

Thursday Commenced this day with heavy gales from West N.E.
February 23 further main tops plenty chumbers and daylight
at 60 to the North of the Gulf Stream once more

Middle and latter breeze from N.W. Shift a heavy
sea on her Starboard. Quarters one sail in sight

Latitude 42° 30' 30" Long 60° 30'

Friday Begins this day with fresh breeze from N.W.
February 24 and latter ship heading N.W. by S. saw
a brig steering the same way. At midnight latter
breeze and to the Northward and clear weather

Latitude 36° 30'

Saturday Commenced this day with the breeze N.W.
February 25 Middle and latter the same two Bays steering
the same way from West by S.

Latitude 40° 30' 30" Long 70° 00'

Sunday Commenced this day with fine breeze from West N.E.
February 26 at 11 P.M. Midnight strong breeze from N.W. Double
reef tops latter more moderate let top gallant
sails made the same to the west of Fire Island

Sounded 20 fath. Gray sand with some shells
Spoke a New York Pilot Boat Sandy's hook. Heavy
besides 12 leagues. Chron 70 miles to the East

Monday Commenced this day with lite breeze from N.E. steering
February 27 at 10 P.M. Let the Main Poles
