

## Ship Climatus New London

Wednesday November 8th

Begins with calm weather lured far humpbacks  
Did not get fast at night fresh breeze from  
N.W. took in gallant sails by which ship stood  
in to the land saw nothing but porpoises  
Lat 25.48 Long 112.40

Thursday November 9

Commences with light breeze from the Westward  
saw a humpback lured did not get fast land  
6 miles distance at night saw fresh from West  
and W.N.W. carried all sail leaving out  
out of the bay and running S.W. ship  
leading along with the land last part  
fresh breeze saw nothing steering down the  
Lat 24.48 Long 113.40

Friday Nov 10

Begins with fresh breeze from N.W. steering South  
at night steered S.E. last part saw humpback  
lured did not get fast  
Lat 22.52 Long 113.00

Saturday November 11

Begins with fresh breeze from N.W. in forenoon  
trying the land at night saw a school of  
blackfish lured so last saw no more of them  
in the morning took out the remainder  
of the bone and dried it the crew has  
got to be so nice their is nothing good enough  
for them in the ship to eat a barrel of beef  
being a little rusty they made a great fuss  
about it  
Lat 22.56 Long 111.06

## Cruising for Sperm Whale off Cape St Lucas

Sunday November 12th 1834

Begins with fine weather steering in for the land  
saw the bone below at 6 P.M. Cape St Lucas  
saw East by S Lat 20 miles visible and last part  
light breeze and calm weather saw finbacks saw a  
bryg steering East  
Lat 22.54 Long 110.29

Monday November 13

Begins with calm weather at night Cape Lucas 5 miles  
distance at 8 A.M. went in shore to get some recruits  
brought a beef butter a lot of oranges had to let them  
be till next day third mate Carpenter and basketeer drunk  
I had great trouble in getting the boat off but I  
got aboard at last some how or rather by help

Tuesday November 14

Calm with fine weather at night  
laying off and on A.M. went in shore got  
of a lot of oranges and some beef  
Thus Ends

Wednesday November 15

Begins with light breeze and calm weather  
at night got every thing aboard potatoes  
beef and oranges ready for sea and all  
saber dropped off calm lured the boats  
towed the ship off shore at 7 P.M.  
light breeze from N.E. steering S.E. last  
part steered East saw a ship heading  
to the Northward Thus Ends  
Lat 22.45 Long 109.00
