

Ship Cleaveland New London

Monday January 29

Begins with strong winds and squally weather
At night all the men come aboard except John Carley
Michael Blinn Fred Link & George Cook
at midnight get the two of the men aboard
they was stowed away by two natives one
of the white men Thus ends at anchor

Tuesday January 30

Begins with fine weather larboard watch
Shaw on liberty the natives brought
the men aboard by the name of Jacob Cooper
that stowed away my two men I took him
and put him in to prison while I lay down
at 3 A.M. get under way settled with the natives
for watering ten dollars and rum cloth
Set the white fellow on shore that stowed
my men away Michael Blinn and John
Carley at Urelian passed Omitikoo
saw two ships at anchor and one under
way Thus ends

Lat 10° 00' Long 139° 54'

Wednesday Jan 31

Begins with strong winds steering N.W.
Ship started to leaking three 24 hours
Leaked 15 spelly last part weather the same at twelve
passed Newhehwa Lat 8° 41' Long 140° 50'

Thursday Jan February 1st

Begins with strong winds and pleasant
weather steering N.W. saw plenty of porpoises
Lat 6° 18' Long 141° 50'

Bound to the Sandwich Islands

Friday February 2nd

Begins with strong winds and pleasant weather
steering N.W. at 7 A.M. saw a school of sperm
whales going quick to Eastward could not get
near them Lat 4° 14' Long 142° 50'

Saturday February 3rd

Begins with light breezes from the Eastward
steering N by W. and overhauling with
Mr. Schiller for not stanching a watch
he has not stanch a watch ~~half~~ of the
time for the last two months in the night
he is a lowly quarrelsome fellow last part light
breezes and pleasant weather Lat 2° 15' Long 143° 10'

Sunday February 4th

Begins with light breezes from the Eastward steering
N by W with all sail set the west part of these
24 hours weather the same Lat 0° 50' south Long 144° 40'

Monday February 5th

Comm with light winds and pleasant weather steering
North employed washing bone Lat 0° 10' north Long 145° 00'

Tuesday February 6th

Comm with light breezes from N.E. steering North
with all sail set employed washing bone
last part weather the same saw one finback
Lat 2° 02' N Long 145° 50'

Wednesday February 7th

Begins with light breezes from S.E. steering N by E
a strong current setting to the westward last part
wind light as usual finished washing bone
Lat 3° 25' Long 146° 15'
