weather steering N. by W. finished bunking down
98 Bundles at night fresh breeze and squally
last part winds light and baffling Lat 6.46 Long 146.05

Saturday February 10th
Begins with light breeze from N. E. heading N. N. W.
middle and last part fresh breeze and squally
stowed down the sperm oil in the after hatch
Lat 9.10 Long 146.50

Sunday February 11th
Begins with strong trade and squally weather steering
N. by N. with all sail set at night blow on fresh
tack in gallantails last part set all sail
Lat 11.50 Long 147.04

Monday February 12th
Begins with strong trade and squally steering N. by N.
with all sail set at night tack in gallantails last part
light breeze and pleasant Lat 14.05 Long 158.25

Tuesday February 13th
Begins with light trade and pleasant weather
steering N. by W. last part the same
Lat 16.50 Long 151.59

Wednesday February 14th
Begins with light trade winds and pleasant weather
steering N. by W. last part calm weather
Lat 17.20 Long 152.58

Thursday Feb 15th
Begins with calm weather and ends the same
Lat 17.50 Long 153.45

Friday Feb 16th
Begins with calm weather and rainsqualls last part
weather the same Lat 18.30 Long 153.12

Saturday Feb 17th
Begins with light breeze and calm weather at 4 P.M.
Owyhee South End bare "N. N. W." dist 40 miles
by reckoning at twelve hours about till morning last part
fresh breeze with rainsqualls Lat 19.12

Sunday Feb 18th
Begins with light breeze and rainsqualls at 4 P.M.
Harakakoa Bay bare N. by E. dist 10 miles thru the
night heavy thunder squalls with sharp lightning
attended with plenty of rain last part weather about
the same Thus Ends

Monday Feb 19th
Begins with light baffling winds and plenty of
rain at night got with in about four miles of
the anchorage wind hauled off last to give up giving
in saw a ship bound in thru the night heavy
rain last part calm Thus Ends

Tuesday February 20th
Begins with calm weather at 4 P.M. light breeze
from the westward at 6 P.M. came to anchor
thru the night plenty of rain last cloudy weather
Thus Ends
