men that deserted Fredrick Link they have not
yet found middle and last part fine weather
shift my bone on board Schooner S. S. to Honolulu
97 bundles Thus Ends

Friday February 23

Begins with fine weather starboard watch
shore on liberty last part fine weather imployed
painting ship starboard watch shore on liberty
Thus Ends

Saturday February 24

Begins with fine weather caught small Link took
him on board threw the night rainy last part
cloudy weather Ends saying at anchor

Sunday Feb 25

Begins with cloudy weather at night plenty of rain
last part pleasant weather starboard watch shore on
liberty Ends saying at anchor

Monday February 26

Begins with fine weather and ends the same
starboard watch shore on liberty imployed
painting ship Thus Ends

Tuesday February 27

Begins with fine weather and ends the same
starboard watch shore on liberty
Ends saying at anchor

Wednesday Feb 28

Begins with fine weather in the night at
go the sea anchor at 10 have up and
cleared the anchorage last part fine weather
Ends saying at anchor

Thursday March 1st

Begins with fine weather and ends the
same discharged Matthias Frank and shift
on board back Link suspended ends

Friday March 2nd

Begins with fine weather at 4 A.M. get under
way with light breeze off the land last part calm
and cloudy Karamakoa Bay 10 miles distance
leaving S. E. Thus Ends The Day

Saturday March 3rd

Begins with cloudy weather and calm a heavy
dew falling from the southward at 6 P.M.
came on a heavy gale from the southward
caused all hands double reef the topsails
at 8 P.M. have to under a close reef main topsails
midnight blows very heavy last part strong gales
and squally weather Thus Ends

Sunday March 4th

Begins with strong gales from south
at night heavy thunder and sharp lightning
with plenty of rain sleet few topsails stopped
but a new one last part heavy gales from W and S.W.
at twelve o'clock off Karamakoa haul up on the
wind leading N.W. Thus Ends
