Thursday March 15th

Begins with fine weather saw five ships
Laying off and on at Honolulu one
whaler in the Harbour Chronometer 20 miles
to fast middle and last part fresh breezes
and squally weather Thru's End
Lat 20° 40' Long 160° 25'

Friday March 16th

Begins with fresh breezes and squally weather
at night blows on heavy in squalls Double
reef the topsails took in jib and mainsail
middle and last part weather the same
Lat 19° 40' Long 162° 30'

Saturday March 17

Begins with fresh gales and squally weather
steering W S W with foresail and Double
reef main topsail set last part fresh gales
and clear weather set Double reef topsails
employed painting boats Lat 19° 15' Long 165° 21'

Sunday March 18

Begins with fresh gales from S E and clear weather
steering off S W with Double reef topsails set
last part weather about the same Ends the Day
Lat 18° 54' Long 168° 00'

lance worked at Kakaia
Kauai Bay

Monday March 19

Begins with fresh gales from S E steering
off with full topsails set sent down main royal
yard last part weather the same
Lat 19° 10' Long 170° 50'

Bound Swards The Melish Bank

Tuesday March 20

Begins with strong gales from S E steering off
with double reef topsails set at night took in
fore and main topsail heading to the Northward
Lat 19° 50' Long 171° 30'

Wednesday March 21

Begins with strong gales from S E heading
N N W under a clear reef main topsail and foresail
last part heavy gales with rain squally S E ahead
By Sea Lat 20° 10' Long 172° 00'

Thursday March 22

Begins with heavy gales from the Eastward heading
East North last part the same with plenty of rain
N Observation By Sea Lat 20° 40' Long 172° 4'

Friday March 23

Commences with heavy gales from East with plenty of
rain heading S by E thru the night tremendous
heavy squalls with rain last part weather
about the same Ends N Observation
Lat 21° 22' Longitude By Sea 173° 00'

Saturday March 24

Begins with heavy gales from S E and plenty of rain
at 4 P M were ship heading E S E blows on heavy
in middle and last part the same Ends N Observation
By Sea Lat 21° 40' Long 173° 15'

Grand Thomas sick

Sunday March 25

Begins with heavy gales from S E not usual and
plenty of rain last part light gales from East and
clear weather set double reef topsails Thru's End
Lat 21° 26' Long 173° 52'
