

Ship Clements

Monday April 30

Begins with heavy gales from N.W. steering North at 6 P.M. wind hauls N.W. in a squall have to under a close reef main topsail middle and last part heavy gales with snow squalls
Lat 50° 55' Long 152° 40'

Tuesday April May 1st

Begins with heavy gales from N.W. with cold disagreeable weather last part light breezes from West with a heavy swell on E. side
Lat 51° 23' Long 152° 15'

Wednesday May 2nd

Begins with light breezes from S.W. steering North saw one white whale bowed did not get fast at night took in sail last part fresh breezes from South with some fog saw nothing
Lat 52° 40' Long 152° 00'

Thursday May 3rd

Begins with light breezes from the southward steering North at night foggy took in sail last part fresh gales from N.W. saw one small weight whale to rough to four
Lat 53° 19' Long 150° 30'

Friday May 4th

Begins with fresh gales from N.W. steering N.E. with double reef topsails set at night took in sail saw nothing last part strong gales and clear weather
Lat 53° 34' Long 149° 01'

Cruising for Whale when ever they are to be found

Saturday May 5th

Begins with fresh gales from N.W. heading N.N.E. with close reef topsails set at night saw two whale to windward took them to be finbacks last part light breezes and fine weather
Lat 54° 14' Long 148° 00'

Sunday May 6th

Begins with light breezes from N.W. and pleasant weather saw nothing last part light breezes from S.E. steering S.N.E. Lat 54° 50' Long 146° 21'

Monday May 7th

Begins with light breezes from S.E. steering N.N.E. per compass saw two finbacks the land knows when I shall see weight whale I don't last part fresh breezes from East heading S.W. saw finbacks Lat 56° 40' Long 143° 54'

Tuesday May 8th

Begins with fresh breezes from the East ward saw plenty of finbacks at 6 P.M. saw three weight whale bowed did not get fast at night took in sail at 4 o'clock took ship's lead S.E. till seven o'clock saw nothing but finbacks close to the Northward saw plenty of finbacks and one weight whale bowed went on to him and killed
Lat 57° 42' Long 145° 22'

Wednesday May 9th

Begins with light breezes from East saw plenty of finbacks at 4 P.M. saw one weight whale went on to him number of times and killed at night drew the land Mount St. Elias bearing N.N.E. dist 100 miles S.W. saw two whale bowed did not get fast saw another bowed took him
Long side Lat 57° 39' Long 145° 15'
