Lat 59° 08 Long 143° 30

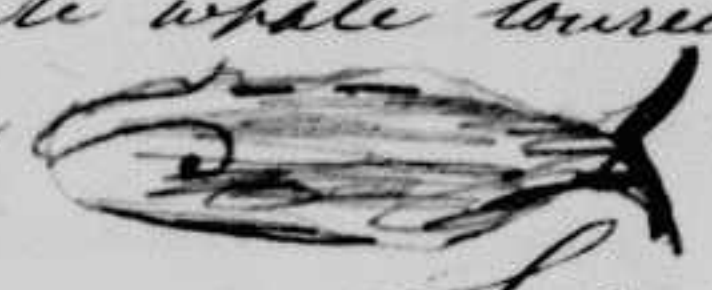
Monday June 18th
Begins with light airs from S E three
ships in sight two boiling saw one rite
whale going quick to windward last part
fresh breezes from East Double reef the
topsails saw finbacks Lat 58° 49

Tuesday June 19th
Begins with fresh breezes from the Eastward
saw a whale bore got fast and Dravid
saw another went on and settled better
luck next time last part strong breezes from
East with plenty of rain saw nothing
Ends 10 Observation

Wednesday June 20
Begins with strong breezes from the Eastward
with plenty of rain at night took in sail
saw nothing A M saw two rite whale going quick
did not bore last part foggy Ends Ends

Thursday June 21
Begins with light breezes from the Eastward
spoke ship Bengal Newfoundland two whale
saw Bark Neptune Newfoundland boiling
last part calm weather Ends Ends

Friday June 22
Begins with calm weather spoke Bark Neptune
Newfoundland boiling three sperm whale A M saw
two rite whale bore got one saw Bark Neptune
got one  Ends Lat 59° 18

Saturday June 23
Begins with light airs from the Southward cut
the whale in cleared up decks A M started
the whales last part calm three ships in sight
two boiling Ends Lat 59° 07 Long 143° 20

Sunday June 24
Begins with calm weather at night light
breezes from the Westward heading in towards
the land at 6 A M wave ship heading off shore
Bark Neptune in sight Lat 59° 08 Long 143° 00

Monday June 25th
Begins with light airs from W S W heading in
shore at night saw one rite whale bore did
not get fast A M saw one going quick
stood close in to the land saw nothing
Lat 59° 45
