

Ship Clematis New Bedford

Tuesday June 26

Begins with fresh breezes from West steering S by East per compass saw plenty of finbacks. A M stowed down the oil spoke ship Schettland New Bedford paper whale two of them she picked up
Thus Ends

Wednesday June 27

Begins with fresh breezes from West steering N by E saw one rite whale towed went on and settled went on board ship Schettland last part light breezes with sun fog stood close in to the land
Thus Ends

Thursday June 28

Begins with light breezes from the westward at 4 P M saw a rite whale towed got fast got him long side at 4 A M last part calm land 20 miles distance out the whale in cleared up clouds
Thus Ends No Obv

Friday June 29

Light breeze from N by E saw Bark Neptune whaling at night lay aback heading in shore A M ship off West last part calm with sun fog
Thus Ends No Obv

Saturday June 30

Begins with calm weather land 25 miles distance at 6 P M saw a dead whale about 8 miles off sent two boats after it cut two of my fingers very bad with the Manganese the dead whale turned out to be a sperm whales head that Capt Green lost it was not worth taking
Thus Ends
Lat 39° 13' Long 145° 30'

Cruising for Whale off Rose Island

Sunday July 1st

Begins with light breeze from West and fine weather saw finbacks and humpbacks one sail in sight last part light breezes from East steering West two sails in sight to the westward boiling
Thus Ends Lat 38° 56' Long 145° 41'

Monday July 2nd

Begins with light breeze from E N E steering West three sails in sight at night heading in shore saw ~~three~~ ^{three} Island dist 25 miles saw two dead whale so bad was not worth taking I broke out the after hatch stowed down the oil - saw one rite whale towed did not get fast spoke ship Jefferson Saghar bar 7 whale this season
Thus Ends
Lat 39° 36' Long 145° 40'

Tuesday July 3rd

Begins with fresh breezes from the Eastward steering S by W finished stowing down the oil at night saw Rose Island distance 10 miles having W S W last part light gales with rain steering South bound for Hemetah
saw I saw nothing here to stop for
Thus Ends
Lat 38° 48' Long

Wednesday July 4th

Begins with light gales from East steering South saw nothing Cooper employed
Leaving off the provision last part calm got a lunar observation Lat 37° 29' Long By
By Lunar Obs 146° 48' Obs 148° 20'
Chronometer is 1° 40 miles
to fast By Lunar Observations
