Friday July 6th

Begins with fresh gales from S.E. with rain heading S.W. by S at night light breezes from south last part light airs and baffling

Lat 57.08 Long 150.50

Saturday July 7th

Begins with light airs from south and baffling saw nothing middle and last part light breezes from S.E. saw Stadyak Dist 25 miles saw one rite whale going quick in shore bower did not get fast

Ends No Observations

Sunday July 8th

Begins with light breezes from East steering S by East per compass saw humpbacks one sail in sight found the same way last part calm and foggy two sails in sight

Ends No Day

Monday July 9th

Begins with calm weather with dense fog at night light breezes from S.E. with rain heading S.W. last part light breezes from N.W. and fine weather

Lat 54.50 Long 154.15

Bound for Kamtschatka Sea

Tuesday July 10

Begins with light breezes from N.W. steering S.W. by S last part fresh breezes from N.W. saw plenty of finbacks and humpbacks

Lat 53.37 Long 157.58

Wednesday July 11

Begins with fresh breezes from N.W. steering S.W. by S per compass last part light airs from S.W. heading N.W. by N

Lat 52.13 Long 159.20

Thursday July 12th

Begins with light breezes from south steering S.W. by S picked up a dead greenfish at night fresh gales from S.E. double reef the topsails & N.W. weather more moderate made all sails. Casper drunk raising can be chided me twice the last time I have him down on deck warned him sum with an end of a rope and drove him below he was quite possible after it he made all kinds of threats that he would take my life &c I turned him out of the cabin in to the storeroom for his back behaviour last part strong breezes with plenty of rain

Friday July 13th

Begins with strong breezes from S.E. steering S.W. by S at 4 P.M. blows on heavy double reef the topsails at 6 P.M. took in shut blows on heavy from S.W. middle heavy gale with a heavy sea on last part gale abated set close reef topsails
