Friday February 1st 1836
Begins with strong breezes from S^E steering
N^W by N^W with all sail set last part calm.
Lat 46° 35' Long 174° 34'

Saturday February 2nd
Calm with calm weather about the main gallathea
repairs it last part strong breezes from North
and N^E with heavy rains Ends 8th Observation
By Sec Lat 46° 45' Long 174° 00'

Sunday February 3rd
Calm with baffling winds from the southward
and heavy rains at 5 P.M. wind hauls West
blowing fresh in squalls last part fresh gales
from N^W Lat 46° 32' Long 173° 30'

Monday February 4th
Calm with fresh gales from S^W heading
N^W by N^W with double reef topsails set at
night heavy squalls with rain took in sail
last part light airs and baffling had heavy
thunder and sharp lightning with much rain
at 8 A.M. saw a No. 1. By Sec
water spout Lat 46° 45' Long 164° 15'

Tuesday February 5th
Calm with light breezes from the northward
cleared up heavy clouds in the horizon mercury
in the barometer berry low standing at 29
inches and continues to fall set down fair
and moon gallathea threw the night sharp
lightning saw two water spouts last part
winds from every point of the compass
Ends 10th Observation
By Account Lat 46° 30' Long 164° 20'

Wednesday February 6th
Begins with strong breezes from N^W by N^W
heading S^W with double reef topsails set
at night blows on heavy in squalls took
in sail have to heading North last part
light gales with squalls and plenty of rain
Ends 10th Observation By Sec Lat 47° 11' Long 164° 15'

Thursday February 7th
Begins with moderate breezes from the southward with
thick weather steering West last part light breezes
from southward Lat 46° 51' Long 166° 42'

Friday February 8th
Commenced with light baffling winds from S^W
last part fresh breezes from south Lat 45° 45' Long 171° 02'

Saturday February 9th
Commenced with light breezes from the southward steering
West S^W last part fresh breezes from the Northward
Lat 46° 06' Long 179° 46'

Sunday February 10th
Begins with fresh breezes from S^W heading
S^W by N^W under double reef topsails
last part strong gales Lat 46° 54' Long 178° 45'

Monday February 11th
Commenced with fresh gales from N^W at night
light breezes heading N^W by S last part wind
wind S^W were ship heading West Ends
Lat 47° 00' Long 176° 57'

Tuesday February 12th
Calm with fresh breezes from the southward heading West
last part strong gales from N^W by N^W heading S^W
saw a school of blackfish banded and got one
Lat 46° 24' Long 174° 00'
