last part fine weather saw porpoises Ends
Lat 40.05 Long 179.40

Tuesday March 11
Com with light breezes from South saw a school
of blackfish bound got three last part fresh gales
from the Southward Lat 39.22 Long 179.16

Wednesday March 12
Begins with strong gales from South at
night took in sail blow on heavy last part
heavy gales from West saw sharp lightning
in the night N 10 W Lat 39.10 Long 175.50

Thursday March 13
Com with heavy gales from S W with very
heavy squalls took in the main topsail
last strong gales with high sea steering
N 11 W by N with trouble reef topsails set
Lat 38.26 Long 179.41

Saturday March 15
Begins with light breezes from South steering N 11 W

Com with light and from S E steering N 11 W by N
last part weather the same Lat 34.56 Long 179.00

Monday March 17
Com with light and from East and pleasant weather steering
West last part weather about the same Lat 34.40 Long 177.30

Tuesday March 18
Com with fresh breezes from S E steering N by South
last part light baffling winds from East
Lat 34.01 Long 175.24

Wednesday March 19
Begins with light baffling winds from N E steering
West at 6 P.M. left off S W for Bay of Islands
in them the heaviest sharp lightning double reef the topsails
headed to the Southward saw two schools of
blackfish bound did not get past Lat 34.17 Long 174.54

Thursday March 20th
Com with baffling winds from the Eastward
saw two schools of blackfish going quick did not
lose last part fresh breezes from E S E at 12 o'clock
came to anchor at Bay of Islands Ends
