Sunday May 11th  
Begins with fresh breeze from West  
and pleasant weather steering E by S  
last part light breeze from North with a  
heavy swell heaving from S<sup>W</sup> Ends  
Lat 47° 20' Long 111° 30'

Monday May 12th  
Comm. with light baffling winds from North  
with a heavy swell on barometer standing low  
at night wind from East and rainy at night  
wind from all points of the compass took in  
the maintop sail sent down fore and mizen  
gallant yard last part heavy rains with  
a heavy swell on heaving from all ways  
mercury in the barometer standing at 28.9  
Ends No Observation  
By Ace Lat 48° 00' Long 111° 00'

Tuesday May 13th  
Begins with light baffling winds from  
East with heavy rains at 6 P.M. wind  
came out S<sup>W</sup> blowing very heavy  
threw the night very heavy squalls and  
high sea at 6 it blew off E<sup>N</sup> & under close  
reef topsails Lat 47° 42' Long 110° 36'

Wednesday May 14th  
Comm with fresh gales from S<sup>W</sup> steering  
East with double reef topsails set  
last part heavy squalls and baffling  
Lat 48° 18' Long 108° 31'

Bound towards Cape Horn

Thursday May 15th  
Begins with baffling winds from S<sup>W</sup>  
and heavy squalls steering E by S with double  
reef topsails set middle heavy rain squalls  
at 7 A.M. wind hauld south last part plenty  
of rain in squalls Lat 49° 05' Long 106° 29'

Friday May 16th  
Begins with strong gales from S<sup>W</sup> with  
heavy squalls steering East with double  
reef topsails set at night wind hauld West  
took one reef out of the topsails set  
fore and main gallant sails middle gale  
increasing took in gallant sails double reef  
the topsails last part heavy gales and high  
sea Lat 49° 56' Long 101° 49'

Saturday May 17th  
Begins with heavy gales from S<sup>W</sup> steering  
E by S with close reef topsails set at 6 P.M.  
took in fore and mizen topsail blows on  
very heavy with a high sea on ridge in the  
flying jib boom at 2 A.M. wind hauld West in  
a heavy rain squall gale abated last part fresh  
gales from South with heavy rains & high  
sea No observ by Ace Lat 50° 30' Long 98° 56'

Sunday May 18th  
Begins with fresh gales from S<sup>W</sup> steering  
with plenty of rain steering E by S with  
close reef topsails set middle and last  
part heavy gale from S<sup>W</sup> with most  
harsh squalls steering E by N with close reef  
topsails set Ends Lat 51° 20' Long 96° 20'
