Monday May 19th

Begins with very heavy gales from S.W. steering E.S.E. under a close reef main topsail and foremast at 4 P.M. blows on so heavy have to mast sealant squalls with a high sea from ten to twelve blows a hurricane soon after twelve moderated S.W. kept off E by S under close reef topsails Lat 51° 04' Long 85° 40'

Tuesday May 20th

Come with heavy gales from S.W. steering E by North with close reef topsails set. Last part the same Ends Lat 54° 50' Long 89° 36'

Wednesday May 21st

Begins with heavy gales from S.W. steering E by N with close reef topsails set at 4 P.M. took in the foremast hove to on the wind heading S E by E middle and last part weather more moderat steering E S E. Ends Lat 51° 56' Long 88° 00'

Thursday May 22nd

Begins with strong gales from S.W. steering E S E with close reef topsails set at night blows in heavy in squalls and dirty weather nothing like Cape Horn last part heavy gales from S.W. with high sea have to under close reef fore and maintop sail Lat 52° 26' Long 86° 26'

Tuesday May 23rd

Begins with heavy gales from S.W. with high sea heading S E by E with close reef ^{fore mast} main topsail set last part moderate breezes with a heavy swell on set gallantails Lat 52° 40' Long 88° 26'

Saturday May 24th

Begins with light baffling winds from S.W. with a heavy swell on at night wind hauled West steering S E per compass last part very heavy gales and high sea shudding under close reef fore and main topsail Ends Lat 54° 32' Long 85° 20' at 2 P.M.

Sunday May 25th

Begins with very heavy gales from W.S.W. and high sea shudding under close reef fore and main topsail at 3 P.M. took in fore topsail gale increasing with a very high sea ship rolling it in on one side and out on the other at 4 P.M. gale abated last part baffling winds from S.W. with a very heavy sea on Ends No Observation By Sec Lat 55° 50' Long 80° 21'

Monday May 26th

Begins with baffling winds from S.W. with snow squalls with a heavy sea on steering E by S with close reef topsails set middle and last part very heavy gales from West S.W. attended with heavy squalls Ends Lat 57° 10' Long 76° 50'

Tuesday May 27th

Begins with very heavy gales from S.W. shudding under close reef maintop sail and foremast steering East at night kept off S by S per compass last part strong gales and squally Lat 57° 50' Long 73° 50'
