in gallantsails close reef the topsails middle weather
more moderat last part heavy gales at 7 P.M.
hauled up E N E ship goes to the northward
further than I expected. Lat 54° 24' Long 69° 00'

Thursday May 29th

Begins with very heavy gales from S S W
Steering E by North per compass took in
foretopsail at 2 P.M. blows on so heavy took
in the fore sail and home to heading S E and
off to E S E at 3 P.M. gale abated but close
reef topsails hup off E by N. Ends N. Obsv
By Sec Lat 54° 25' Long 66° 50'

Friday May 30th

Begins with strong breezes from South
Steering E S E at 2 P.M. hup off N E by E
at 4 P.M. which baffling and very cold
Thermometer standing at 20 last part strong
breezes and cloudy weather no catched
By Sec Lat 56° 40' Long 68° 46'

Saturday May 31st

Begins with strong breezes from South and
cloudy Steering N E by N per compass
at 8 P.M. hup off N E by E by compass last part
light breezes and pleasant at 10 P.M. topsails
sent up mizen gallantsail. Ends
Lat 55° 23' Long 58° 46'
variation 2 points
easterly

Sunday, June 1st

Begins with moderat breezes from the southward
Steering N E by E per compass at 4 P.M. hup
on heavy from West Doubble reef the topsails
last part fresh gales from South and N E
Ends Lat 53° 16' Long 56° 32'

Monday, June 2nd

Begins with fresh gales from S E with snow squally
steering N S E per compass at 4 P.M. hup
N E by N. blows heavy in squally last part fresh
breezes from W by S set shudlingsails. Ends
Lat 51° 31' Long 53° 50'

Tuesday, June 3rd

Begins with strong breezes from S W with heavy
squalls attended with snow took in shudlingsails
at 4 P.M. hup on heavy in squally S W weather
more moderat at shudlingsails. Ends N. Observation
By Sec Lat 48° 45' Long 52° 20'

Wednesday, June 4th

Begins with fresh gales from South with heavy
squally took in shudlingsails at 4 P.M. Doubble
reef the topsails blows on heavy last part gale abated
made all sail. Ends N. Obsv By Sec
Lat 46° 20' Long 51° 00'

Thursday, June 5th

Com with strong breezes from South with dark
squally weather attended with frequent hail squally
steering S S E last part weather about the same. Ends
Lat 44° 50' Long 48° 10'
