 7th P.M. First part light breezes from N.W. by to the W. and thickening in with driving
 rain, and heavy atmosphere.
 Longt by Obs 66.47.45 W.
 Middle part clear away calm at 11
 P.M. took a light breeze S.E. and freshening
 up, with hard snow storm, W. by N.
 Latter part strong breezes and squalls of
 snow.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 18th
 9th S.E. 11.1.40 First part strong breezes and overcast
 from S.E. and veered to the S. all sail set
 at 3 steering W. by N.
 Middle part at 7 squalls and haggling
 on opposite tacks, with snow squalls
 Latter part fresh breezes and snow
 squalls from W. by N. on opposite
 tack, one sail in sight.
 Lat by mariner Alt 57.49 S.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 19th
 10th First part fresh breezes and snow
 squalls from W. by N. by to the S. W.
 under whole topsails and courses,
 one sail in sight.
 Longt by Obs 72.09.45 W.
 Middle part calmer and haggling
 on opposite tacks frequent snow squalls
 Latter part thick drizzly rain,
 with moderate gales and strong snow
 squalls from W. by N. by to the S. W.
 Lat by mariner Alt 57.29 S.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Thursday Nov 22nd
 10th W. by N. First part fresh gales and pleasant
 between squalls under two reef main
 top sail and fore sail.
 Longt by Obs 73.08.45 W.
 Middle part fresh gales and squalls
 from W. by N.
 Latter part pleasant between squalls,
 and moderating, made close reef fore topsail
 mainsail and jib.
 Lat by mariner Alt 56.12 S.
 Longt by Obs 73.29 W.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Friday Nov 23rd
 10th W. by N. First part strong breezes and squally
 from W. by N. by to the S. W. at 3 P.M.
 veered to the S.
 Middle part the same, with thick drizzly
 rain, squalls more light.
 Latter part at 7 A.M. fresh breeze
 and increasing to strong breezes and
 thick fog. No observation.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Saturday Nov 24th
 10th W. by N. First part strong breezes and thick
 drizzly rain from W. by to the S. W.
 Middle part the same, saw a sail steering E.
 Latter part at 10 A.M. clear away
 from the S. veered ship to the S. W.
 Lat by mariner Alt 58.27 S.
