First part strong breeze and heavy squalls from W and pleasant between squalls by to the S.W. under double reef topsails.
Long by Obs. 13.21 W
Middle part fresh gales and squally under double reef main top sail and foresail, on opposite tacks.
Latter part pleasant between squalls one sail in sight.
Left by Maridian Alt 56.59 S.

4 P.M.
First part moderate gales and pleasant between squalls from W.
Long by Obs. 73.33, 45 W
at 5 Squalls in rapid succession.
Middle part the same from W.S.W.
by to the S.W. at 2 U.M. moderating.
Latter part strong breeze and snow squalls.
Left by Maridian Alt 56.34 S.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Tuesday, Jan 27th

First part strong breeze and snow squalls from W.S.W. to W. on opposite tacks.
Long by Obs. 14.03 W
Middle part haffling at 4 P.M. break the fore and main top sail yard at 2 U.M. fresh gales and severe to the S. by to the W.S.W.
Latter part moderating and pleasant sent down the fore topsail yard and bent new mainsail.
Left by Maridian Alt 56.19 S.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Wednesday, Jan 28th

107. N.W. N.E. W
First part moderating to calm at 3 P.M. took a light breeze from N.W. by to the W.S.W.
Long by Obs. 15.05 W
at 7 fresh breeze and thickening in front of the ship.
Middle part increasing to strong gales and heavy squalls and severe to the W.S.W.
Latter part heavy gales and squally at 10 A.M. very squalls in quick succession under close reef main top sail.
No observation.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Thursday, Jan 29th

108. W
First part heavy gales and very sharp squalls from W. by to the S. the atmosphere very thick and smoky.
Middle part the same, parted fore and main top sail hal, and broke sprit sail yard and carried away bowsprit shroud.
Latter part continued the same, squalls not quite so heavy; at 10.45 A.M. shipped a heavy sea fore and aft, on the starboard side stove in gangway part of monkey bulwarks and broke in two bow boat, cutt her away.
Left by Maridian alt 57.24 S
also started the main rail forward of the foremast and parted the bulwarks in the main top mast gangway.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Friday, Jan 30th

109. S.W. to S.E. W
4 P.M.
First part moderating fast, still cloudy squalls light, making sail gradually.
at 4 P.M. Long by Obs. 18.18 W
Middle part breeze on again to fresh gales and haffling with sharp squalls.
Latter part moderating and pleasant employed in flying fore top sail yard and clearing up wreckage light breeze from N.W.
Left by Maridian Alt 56.45 S
Long by Obs. 14.59 W
