 Lat by Maridian alt 4.42 S.

 4 P.M. 170 E.S.E. by the wind First part light pleasant weather, variously employed.
 Longt by Obs. 102.10 W
 Middle part the same lying aback under short sail.
 Latter part steering N.E. still fine weather, and no whales.
 Lat by Obs. 4.42 S.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Friday Feb. 1st
 4 P.M. 170 E.S.E. W.S.W. First part moderate breezes and pleasant weather, at 4 P.M. luffed to the wind on the Carboard tack, at sundown took in sail.
 Longt by Obs. 103.08 W
 Middle part lying aback.
 Latter part in the wind Carboard tack, above, variously employed, the weather became a more squally appearance, but still pleasant, but freshening a little.
 Lat by Maridian alt 5.43 S.
 Longt by Lunar Obs 103.29 W
 this morning have anchored the blackfish cut which we caught the

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Feb 2nd
 172 S.E. First part fresh breezes and passing clouds, with a squally appearance at 1 P.M. kept off S.W.
 Longt by Obs. 103.23 W
 Middle part the weather the same, lying aback under short sail, at 1 P.M. rise kept off S.W.
 Latter part some squally, breeze fresh the wack employed in scraping and painting iron work.
 Lat by Maridian alt 4.50 S.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Sunday Jan 3rd
 173 S.E. First part fresh breezes and more pleasant than this fore noon, still employed in cleaning iron work.
 Longt by Obs. 103.41 W
 at sundown luffed to the wind and hauled aback in the Carboard tack.
 Middle part lying aback at daylight hauled forward and made sail.
 Latter part moderate and pleasant with passing clouds, steering S.W.
 Lat by Maridian alt 4.43 S.

Hours Day out Wind Course Remarks on board Monday Feb. 4th
 174 E. First part moderate and pleasant steering S.W. at 4 P.M. steering N.W.
 Longt by Obs. 106.45 W
 at sundown took in sail and hauled aback, middle part lying aback in Carboard tack and daylight kept off S.W. and set standing sails, at 10.30 saw three large sperm whales, covered three boats in pursuit, the waste boat went on and missed, Carboard went on struck and drove one sail in sight.
 Lat by Maridian alt 4.19 S.
