Hours Day out Wind Courses Remarks on board Friday Feb 29th
 195 E.S.E. S.S.W. First part light breezes and near pleasant weather, with light fog clouds.
 4 P.M. Long by Obs 129.02 W. finished mending fore sail, and let it.
 Middle part light breeze, aback, under short sail, at daylight main sail set.
 Latter part light breezes, and light squalls hanging about, with light mist in the morning in the Southern track.
 Lat by meridian Alt 6.46.45

Hours Day out Wind Courses Remarks on board Saturday March 1st
 196 E.S.E. by the wind First part light breezes and pleasant weather on opposite tack.
 4 P.M. Long by Obs 130.24 W. at 10 sharp squalls, with light rain.
 Middle part under double reef top sails, at daylight main sail set.
 Latter part moderate and same squalls by the wind, variously employed in ships duty.
 Lat by meridian Alt 6.30.00

Hours Day out Wind Courses Remarks on board Sunday March 2nd
 197 E.S.E. by the wind First part moderate and pleasant quick passing clouds, by the wind.
 4 P.M. S.E. Long by Obs 130.20 W. Middle part fresh and squally with light rain, under all sails.
 Latter part at 8 A.M. had a sharp squall, took in fore top gall sail, jib and gaff top sail, the remainder of this day more pleasant.
 Lat by meridian Alt 6.31.00

Hours Day out Wind Courses Remarks on board Monday Mar 3rd
 198 S.E. S.W. First part more moderate on downcast, the clouds being the appearance of the light baffling weather and rain.
 4 P.M. S.W. Long by Obs 128.58 W. the wind moderating.
 Middle part the same, still downcast.
 Latter part strong S.W. wind, setting sail, heavy clouds hanging in the S.E. employed in braking out for water.
 Lat by meridian Alt 4.54.00 not correct.
 Long by Obs 128.31 W. not correct.

Hours Day out Wind Courses Remarks on board Tuesday Mar 4th
 199 S. S.W. First part light breezes and heavy clouds rising from the S.W. at 3 P.M. squalls, and rain.
 4 P.M. S.W. Middle part the same.
 Latter part at 7.30 A.M. with a light breeze from W. and veered to the S. same then around to S.W. and set in first with light rain, and gradually increasing to heavy rain, and at heavy winds, in sails, so that we set fore and main top sails, about 11 break away some, and moderate commenced to make sail again, no observation.

Hours Day out Wind Courses Remarks on board Wednesday Mar 5th
 200 S.E. S.W. First part fresh gales and moderate with rain, making sail gradually.
 4 P.M. S.W. at 6 P.M. set main top gallant sail.
 Middle part cleared away fine and pleasant, with trades fresh from S.W.
 Latter part the same, by the wind, variously employed in ships duty.
 Lat by meridian Alt 6.18.00
