During our stop at Lohaine we stowed away 200 lbs. of sperm oil, sent on shore on storage five pipes of Brandy, two casks of new shock heads, marked and the shocks belonging to them, also two casks of old shock heads and shocks belonging to them marked C. N. one Butts from 14.11.24 and one Pippis from 1 to 11 marked B. N. Painted she's got off water and stowed it down and smacked ship, took on board 59 lbs of Potatoes, also 250 charges George on the factors hands and shipped Johnson as steward.
