4 P.M.	2 P.M.	20 N.W.	N.E. W.	First part strong breezes and squally at 2 P.M. veered to the N. Longt by Obs. 166.05. 112. Middle part moderating and overcast, at day light made sail. Latter part light air, saw fin back and mutton birds and water circular. Lat by meridian Alt. 47.20. 112.

Hours	Day out	Wind	Comes	Remarks on board Wednesday April 23rd
4 P.M.	2 P.M.	22 N.W.	N.E. W.	First part light air and overcast, at breising on gradually and thickening up with fresh water still circular. Longt by Obs. 166.23. 112. Middle part veered to the E. at 11 A.M. set in thick with rain and sleet, still breising on. Latter part increasing to fresh gales with sleet falling fast, and veering to the N.E. trying too under close reef main top sail.

4 P.M.	2 P.M.	23 N.W.	N.E. W.	First part strong gales and accompanied with rain and sleet, at 2 P.M. veered ship by to the N.E. Middle part the same with snow squalls. Latter part moderating slowly, and more pleasant between squalls. Obs.
